Mr. J. J. Akerman had the misfortune to lose eight ewes and seventeen lambs, by dogs chasing and worrying them. The dogs were identified and killed, and their owners had to pay damages.

Farmer's Institute meetings were held April 15th and 16th at Ganges Harbor and Burgoyne Bay, the speakers being Messrs. Brandrith and Maxwell Smith; subjects, "Fruit Packing and Care of Orchards."

The Secretary of the Agricultural Association has collected thus far \$164.65 towards paying off the debt on the Hall, but of this amount \$53 has still to be gathered in. When this is done, the debt which on the first of February amounted to \$260.83, will be reduced to \$83.58.
