DEMONS DOWN PANTHERS

This week I thought a look at the World Cup play might be appropriate, especially with the Canadian national soccer team competing for a berth in the finals this month in Honduras.

The World Cup is one of the most prestigious trophies to win in competitive sports as 170 nations

(more than are in the United Nations) play-down over a four-year period to see which teams will comprise the 24 in the final tournament to be held in Spain in 1982.

The preliminary rounds of play are broken into 11 groups of nations with two nations qualifying for the finals from each group. The host nation and the World Cup holder are automatically in the finals to make the full complement of 24.

Canada is in the CONCACAF region which covers North and Central America and the Caribbean. Canada qualified for the CONCACAF finals by winning the North American section of the region over Mexico and the U.S. Mexico also qualified and both are joined by Cuba, Honduras, El Salvador and Haiti

in Honduras to decide which two qualify for Spain.

To date Honduras is the team to beat as they are undefeated but Canada is tied for second after beating El Salvador 1-0, tying Haiti 1-1, and losing to Honduras 1-2. Wins in their two remaining games would send them to Spain.

Should Canada win a berth it would be a tremendous boost to all soccer programs across the country as the sport would be in the spotlight and receive better coverage in our nation. Let us keep our fingers crossed for our team in Honduras.

November 11. Peace, tenuous but real. Veterans paying homage to names inscribed in stone and for a fleeting second are grateful their names do not appear in alphabetical order.

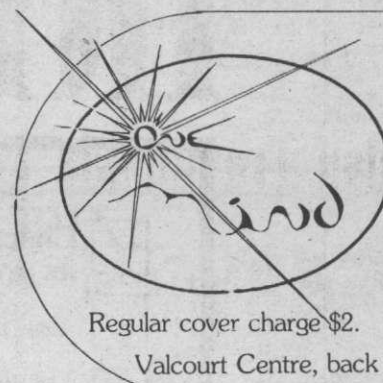
War, someone noted, is dangerous to human health but

Islanders did not forget.



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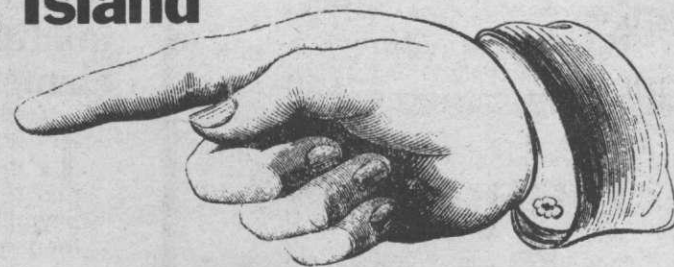

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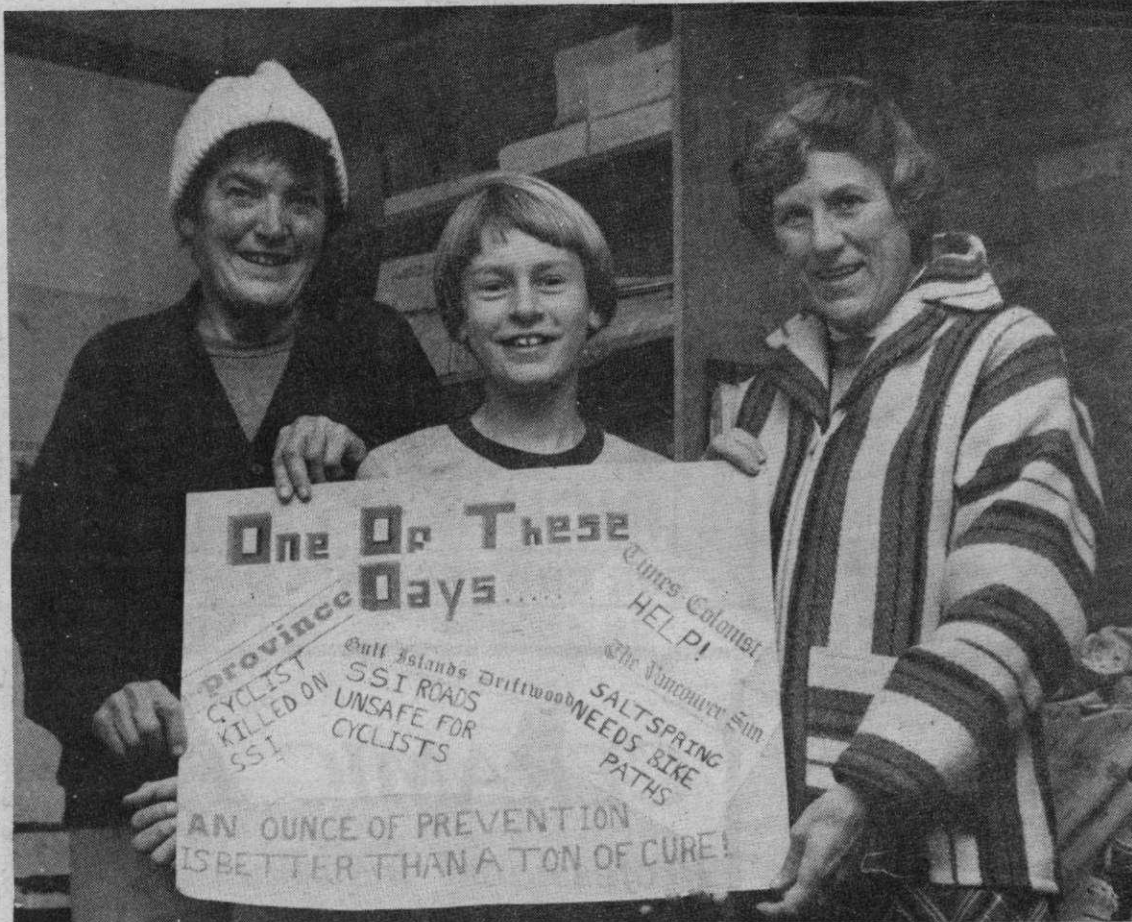

Lassie Dodds admire the winning poster held by artist Chris. The committee asks for support of people by signing a petition to be found at various locations on Salt Spring.



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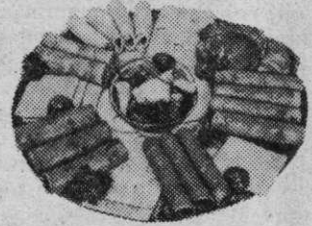

Let's get together again.

None of the signatories of this statement have any equity in the land to be served by the Ganges Sewer. We are a cross section of islanders from differing walks of life and background, and from various parts of the Island. We do have one thing in common, and that is the conviction that it is past the time when the community should put aside the emotional conflicts generated by the Ganges sewerage project.

A great deal of misinformation has been, and is being circulated about what has been, and should remain, a simple difference of opinion between friends and neighbours as to how we can most effectively and safely dispose of sewage in the Ganges area. It is untrue to suggest that the rest of Salt Spring Island will be specifically taxed for this project. The so-called human rights violations by the Government is an extraneous issue, regardless of whether there is some substance to the charge; in fact the authorities could be more justly condemned had they failed to move to protect the public health, since it seemed certain that we, ourselves, were not going to settle the issue. It is a normal everyday right in our society to have hospitals, schools and shopping areas free of sewage contamination.

We have long been fortunate in our easy-going way of life here, and also in the diversity and good humour of our neighbours. Each one of us bears the responsibility to treat our differences in so rational a manner that this community may continue in mutual affection and respect.

Let's keep our perspective.

Think of growing asparagus and be prepared

This appears to be an unlikely time to write about asparagus. However, I have had several inquiries about this, and further, anyone contemplating planting of asparagus will have the advantage of being well prepared when the young crown will be available in early spring.

There are two methods of growing asparagus, the trench method and the raised bed method. Which one to use depends entirely on the kind of drainage you have. This is extremely important as asparagus is a rather long-term investment.

A well made asparagus bed will produce this early and most delicious vegetable for 20 years and longer with little care or trouble. It is also a favourite among market gardeners as asparagus usually fetches a good price at the market due to its earliness and its gourmet appeal.

MINIMUM OF 40

So, how much to plant then. I would say a minimum of 40 plants for a family of four, which may easily be doubled for lovers of asparagus.

And there are also two ways of acquiring your asparagus plants. One is to obtain one-year-old crowns at your local nursery or garden centre, the other is to raise your own from seed.

Asparagus is best sown in early

spring. Germination is somewhat slow at that time of year, so a few radish seeds will mark the row. Sow in shallow drills, half-inch deep, and let them grow until the next spring. Discard weak and small crowns, as these will never amount to much. Transplant into the permanent asparagus bed as follows.

Method 1: for well drained soil, which does not get soggy in our wet winters. This is the most common cause of failure, the young plants simply drown. For this method you must be sure of good drainage in winter as well.

SEAWEED GOOD ADDITIVE

Dig a trench 18 inches deep and one foot wide. Fill with eight inches of good compost and well rotted manure. Seaweed is an excellent additive as asparagus likes salt, phosphorous, potash and minerals, all present in seaweed.

Set your young plants on top of the fill and cover with two inches of good soil. Plants should be spaced 18 inches apart. Dress with three ounces of bonemeal per foot of ditch. As plants grow, keep on filling the ditch with good soil to ground level.

If you like, you can add more soil to create a four to six-inch mound over the row, which will result in longer spears. Always leave two inches of top growth showing when covering with soil.

Method 2: for poorly drained soil. Dig a trench six inches deep and one foot wide. Fill with compost, manure and seaweed as above, to ground level. Set your plants on top of that and cover with three inches of good soil. As plants grow keep on adding good soil as described above. The procedure is the same for both, except with this method you will be making a raised bed or mound, eventually about 2½ feet wide at the bottom and from one to 1½ feet high.

SOIL EXPOSED

The disadvantage of this method

is that a lot of soil is exposed to the air. This requires regular watering through our summer drought period, augmented by moisture retaining mulch. It has the advantage of creating well drained conditions where none exist.

A combination of both methods may be possible depending on drainage conditions. So watch your garden this winter for possible locations for an asparagus bed. Check your drainage and the height of the winter water table.

Six inches of gravel, sloped to drain, under your asparagus row might just do it. If you decide on this, do it now and watch your gravelled ditch through the winter for drainage. This way you have a chance to see what is happening and to correct any drainage problems.

A terraced set-up on sloping ground is another alternative, using any aspects of the described methods to achieve good drainage.

HARVEST IN THIRD YEAR

Asparagus should not be harvested until the third year after planting. This will allow the plants to establish a massive root system with many crowns. Some gardeners harvest very sparingly in the second year.

In any case, there should be no harvesting whatsoever in the first year, this will just slow the whole thing down considerably.

Fertilize your asparagus bed as follows for maximum growth. Apply 1½ ounces of phosphate (bonemeal) and 1½ ounces of potash (wood ashes) per square yard in early spring. In fall, after cutting down stems when leaves have turned yellow, top dress with manure on well drained soil.

On heavy soil, do this in early spring. Feed lightly with liquid manure through the growing season.

Now, the best part, the

harvesting of asparagus. When new shoots appear above the soil, and before the bud begins to expand, cut the spears by thrusting a long, slender knife into the soil to cut a couple of inches above the crown.

Harvesting can continue until the third week of June. After this

let the plants grow to make vigorous growth and strong crowns for next year's harvest.

All this might seem to be a bit of a bother now, but after your first full harvest you will know it was worth it. And you have another 20 or 30 harvest years to look forward to.

Couvelier charges empty

Final dispute between directors as shades of Watergate hover

Saanich Mayor Mel Couvelier engaged in his last foray with Outer Islands Director Jim Campbell at last Wednesday's Capital Regional Board meeting in Victoria. Campbell is withdrawing from the regional administration this fall. A full stage battle ensued until it proved the charges were empty.

Couvelier reported that a tape of a June meeting has been tampered with.

The board tapes all meetings in order that the staff may confirm statements for the records or that directors may check what was said.

"Part of the tape recordings are erased from the tape," he told the meeting. How did this happen, he asked.

Bob Wright accused him of seeking political advantage by

levelling the charge immediately prior to the municipal elections.

He saw a parallel with Watergate and himself cast in the same mould as Nixon. The tape referred to deliberations of his committee.

WHO PAID COSTS?

Couvelier then asked whether public funds were expended on the appearance of a director on a television show in Vancouver in September.

Couvelier agreed that he had not made any enquiries from the staff.

He was merely passing on rumours, he blandly assured his colleagues.

Any rumour he heard, he started, countered Jim Campbell.

The meeting exploded into a bitter exchange.

Executive director Dennis Young explained that the tapes are kept for six months, although they are not the official records of the board's deliberations. He could offer no explanation of the loss of the tape carrying part of the sewer and solid wastes committee meeting in June.

The board asked Grant McRadu, who reported that he had erased the tape in question when it was six months old. He was mistaken, said Bob Wright, it was five months old, but it was an honest mistake.

REFERENCE PRINTED

It came to his attention a day or so ago, said Couvelier. He also told the board that there had been a reference to the missing tape in *Driftwood* on June 10.

He reads neither *Driftwood* nor the *New York Times*, snapped Wright.

Valcourt told the board that on June 3 her alternate, Sabara

Humes, attended the meeting. There was reference made to the cost of the Ganges sewer.

"When she returns she writes out a report on everything that takes place."

The director was concerned and went into Victoria to copy the tape. It was blank, she told the meeting.

There is a difference between being erased and being blank, countered Wright.

Were the minutes correct, asked Tipton.

Why five months and some days later does the matter come up, asked Wright.

RECORDER DIDN'T

The meeting was hurriedly reconvened when Dorothy Maxwell, staff member, was in the board room. She explained that she had been the operator of the recorder on that particular day. It was the first day she had used it and she had made a mistake.

When a partially used tape is fitted the machine requires adjustment in order to record. Unaware of the need, she had failed to make that adjustment.

The chairman apologized to the staff and thanked them for their help.

Transportation assistance to car pools may require permit

Car pools for school children could cause problems in transportation payments, says the ministry of education.

Some children in the Gulf Islands School District live in areas not served by school buses and parents have formed car pools to take them to school.

Transportation assistance paid to the car pools may be contravening the motor vehicle rules.

In a letter to the Gulf Islands School Board, J. Doyle, executive director of schools finance and facilities in the ministry of education, said:

"The possibility of conflict with existing motor vehicle regulations regarding parents transporting other than their own children, and permits requirements as a consequence of transportation assistance payments, has been raised by the Motor Vehicle Branch."

If a parent drives one or more of the neighbours' children to school and is reimbursed for the costs, the

arrangement may be considered a contract with the school board. As such, the car pool would require a permit as a school vehicle and if an accident should occur, the school board could be in difficulty over claims arising.

Wilf Peck, district secretary-treasurer, when presenting the Doyle letter to the board last week, said, "I wonder if it's a matter of concern, to this board and others, to check the legality of this opinion."

The board agreed to have Peck check with the B.C. School Trustees' Association for an interpretation of the claim by the Motor Vehicle Branch.

Tom Davidson, trustee from Saturna, suggested that the district has a loophole if payments of the transportation assistance are made to a joint bank account, which he indicated has been the practice in the Gulf Islands.

The letter noted that payments made directly to individual parents or guardians do not constitute a

contract. Car pools cause the problems.

The letter noted, "Co-operative arrangements among recipients of transportation assistance must not involve the board of school trustees."

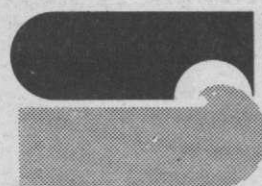

Board repays Valcourt last \$500

Final assessment of \$512 made against regional director Yvette Valcourt by the regional auditors has been accepted as legitimate expenses by the Capital Regional Board.

At last week's meeting a motion to ratify the amount as money expended by the Salt Spring Island director on regional business was challenged by the chairman of the finance committee, Jim Campbell. He asserted that the auditors had made an interpretation of the Valcourt expenses which he could not accept.

The manner in which the expenses had been disallowed by regional staff and partially approved by the auditors had been missed by other directors as well as the press, he charged.

Regional solicitors Douglas Patterson wrote to the board explaining that the expenses incurred in connection with committee work could be ratified

by the board. He prepared the necessary resolution to authorize the payment. It was accepted by the board.

Mc Couvelier moved the resolution and W.J. McElroy seconded it. When Couvelier referred to the investigation of the Valcourt expenses as a "bum rap".

McElroy protested that he had not joined in the motion under such a designation.

Payments under section 788 must have specific authority and payments had been made without that authority, asserted Campbell.

Motion was approved, with Campbell and J.M. Tipton opposing it.

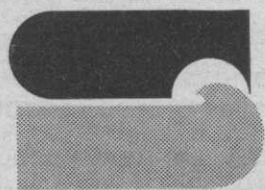

Politics! The all-candidates meeting was last Tuesday, Nov. 11 and was chaired by Walter Ratslaff.

Incumbent school trustee Tom Davidson spoke for the first 10 minutes.

Tom said there were several important personnel decisions coming up, principal for Saturna and district superintendent. He felt he had much to offer since he has been on several selection boards and has a background knowledge of the community.

He also felt his re-election was important because he represents the board at Camosun College. Tom has two more years to serve. He feels that Camosun can provide much-needed vocational services to the islands.

"I have shown that if I set out to do something I will bring it about, such as the Mayne Island Junior Secondary School," he said.

Later he spoke about the large school board budget and said that experience was needed to justify the expenditures.

Elizabeth Bray, the challenger, spoke next. She has been campaigning door to door to ask people about their feelings about the schools.

She felt it was important for her to run as people wanted "accurate representation of what they wanted and said to the school board".

As trustee, she said, she would attend all parents' meetings, be sure the trustee had a regular spot on the parents' meetings' agenda

and in this slot consider upcoming school board items with the parents.

"I don't want to be reactive — it's costly and the problems are extended."

Elizabeth ended by saying that "communication is the key to my platform. I'm energetic and outgoing. I'm interested in maintaining quality education. I have a vested interest — I have a child in school right now."

Questions put to them included: Do kids need paid noon-hour supervision?

Bray: Yes, two teachers can't prepare for afternoon and catch their breath while providing the attentive care parents seem to want.

Davidson: Can't comment, up for discussion with the board.

Bray was asked if she had time with a family to serve adequately.

"My family comes first, but my husband and I have decided I can take the time for this," she replied.

Davidson asked why it was essential that he serve on the Camosun Board, said the board needs to hear from the most isolated community. They have the money and he would like to see it well spent, he said.

Candidate in the Capital Regional District election, John Gaines said he had served a good apprenticeship — five years in the Islands Trust.

Although the Trust is concerned with land use in the Outer Gulf Islands and the CRD handles works and services, Gaines said the skills necessary are the same.

Two points he stressed were that a rural environment be maintained and that services be maintained by local groups. One benefit from this approach would be lower taxes and assessments, he noted.

Gaines was asked if the services of the CRD and Islands Trust overlap, why not incorporate them? The cost is not that much greater than if all services were under one or the other, he replied. "I feel the Islands are a unique asset and that the Trust is of value. If we allow the islands to become a subordinate part of the CRD we would have less opportunity to maintain uniqueness. The elected representation, per capita is very high."

Bob Hindmarch mentioned the number of hours John Gaines put into Saturna's community plan

along with other community members.

Finding mushrooms topic of lecture

Several people showed up at the hall on Sunday to hear Paul Kroeger give a lecture on finding and identifying local mushrooms.

On Monday, many of the same people participated in a field trip at Campbell's farm, during which Paul identified two formerly

unknown species of mushroom which he plans to write up and name after our island.

On Tuesday afternoon Paul came to the school and took both classes on a tour of Lyall Valley.

The students were able to find several varieties of edibles and at least two extremely poisonous types, which impressed upon them the fact that great caution must be observed when collecting for the table.

Keep a salt shaker handy when hunting

This portion, stalking the wild slug, is dedicated to Don Quixote and Ronald Reagan, exemplary seekers of the elusive quarry.

Many determined individuals hoping to escape the expense of purchasing a domesticated slug, have actually captured and partially tamed the wild version.

This not as easy as you might think. The successful hunter must be properly equipped. Included on the list as essential by most big game outfitters are lariats, gloves, kneepads, face masks, running shoes and binoculars, while slug guns and hunting ducks are considered optional.

In addition, some successful hunters swear by their particular brand of wooden hunting slug.

After careful planning and purchasing of the necessary

equipment, you are ready to begin your search. Where to look? Down. Other than that the only advice we can give you is to keep to the damp areas.

Before attempting the actual capture, it is important that you review the following safety rules. Always keep in mind that no matter how docile a slug may appear, a slug is a wild animal. Even a slug with a history of passive behaviour may still turn on you with little or no provocation.

With this in mind, most hunters keep a specially constructed waterproof salt shaker grasped tightly in their hand. And remember, *never, never* stalk wild slugs alone and be sure your partner is someone you can rely on.

High tides were pushed even higher by the southeast gale. At Harbour's End Marina the water rose to the level of the parking area, which was left littered by logs and other debris.

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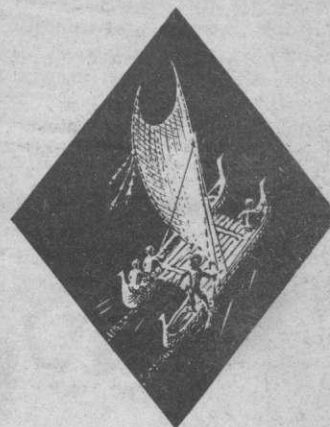
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Contract is awarded for Magic Lakes sewer

S&R Rentals Ltd. have been awarded the contract for the Magic Lakes sewer system at a cost of \$1,165,471.89.

Capital Regional Board last week approved the tender as well as a bylaw to raise a further \$183,000 to meet the final costs of the project.

"It is a very large amount for a very small area," commented J.D. Watts. "Are you sure of the ability of the residents to meet these costs?"

The ministry of municipal affairs has investigated the proposal and is satisfied the islanders can pay, reported Jim Campbell.

Successful bid was one of 11 tenders received for the Pender Island sewage system renewal.
