Phil Hume of the commission received a nasty complaint from a telephone caller.


He attempted to explain that the crews were busy elsewhere but the caller was adamant that the hole should be fixed.





Salt Spring artist is off to Vancouver School of Theology

Rohana Laing of Fulford will be attending the United Church's Vancouver School of Theology for the next three years.

Married for 18 years with three sons, she credits spiritual experiences she has had in guiding her decision that entering the ministry is what she should be

Although Laing has been enrolled as an adult student, she won't be alone. At least 50% of the students at the theological college are over 30 years of age and at least 50% are

Laing has been engaged in an art career and she taught visual arts at Kwantlen College (formerly Douglas College) in Surrey. She taught design; drawing and textile design at the college.

She has attended the Alberta School of Art as well as the Emily Carr School of Art in Vancouver where she earned her degree

Her decision to attend theological school was made two years ago and since then she has been making preparations. She took two years of undergraduate work by mail and attended the University of British Columbia in the summer to study

philosophy.

The Vancouver School of Theology has an excellent reputation in Canada, she noted. It has high academic standards which attract many students who want to go on to gain a Master of Theology

The first year of training centres on basic instruction in theology and the choices expand for the second year. During the final year, Laing will be engaged in field work and more academic training.

The field work includes pastoral training as well as hospital work.







Table salt helps eradicate thistles

Perhaps you have guessed this already, but I have quite fallen in love with this word processor of mine. It is rather neat, falling in love, and so is this wordy mind tool, a double whammy as it were.

You know how it is; when you are in love with something, or somebody, you want to spend all your time with the object of your affections. There should be at least half a dozen of me, though, since I now want to spend all my time with my wife, my kids, my garden, my synthesizer, my writing and my word processor. And you know how it goes with that as well: if you like something a lot you want more of the same.

I would love to have another garden, another synthesizer, and another word processor, and as far as the latter is concerned, I would like it to be a thought processor. Then I could sort of think my thoughts into it, and it would automatically process them into

their appropriate categories, like music, writing, politics and gardening.

Jim Kay of Cusheon Lake Road writes that he has a threefold monster of a thistle on his hands, or rather in his garden. It is between nine and 10 feet tall, greyish in colour, with leaves that are, by actual measurement, 30 inches long, 12 inches wide and deeply serrated with a thorn on each point.

Crowned with multiple branches at the top, it sports purple, thorny blossoms, and is said to be quite attractive in its prime, sufficiently so

that several friends have requested seeds. The stems of this thistle are triangular with a distinct fin at the angle. Unfortunately, I have not been able to find any reference to this amazing specimen among the surprisingly large number of thistles listed in my encyclopedia. Perhaps someone may know and be able to tell us what it is.

Further in the matter of thistles, this time in regard to the dreadful Canadian thistle, which is actually a misnomer, as this thistle hails from Europe. The name is based on the mistaken belief by our American neighbours that they were invaded by a Canadian native. We must be more than grateful then that a method for the eradication of this invasive weed with a pointedly antisocial inclination comes to us, via last month's issue of Organic Gardening, from our southern friends. Susan Mayfield of Maynesville, Ohio, writes that she and her neibhbours have eradicated all their thistles by cutting them off at ground level and pouring a bit of table salt on the fresh cut. Susan states: "I have not salted in years". If this proves to be successful here as well, it may well be a great relief to all thistle-plagued gardeners, if not to our commercial farmers.

Various agricultural research stations have wrestled with this thorny problem for going on 20 years, so far with very limited success. The international thistle has various predators and diseases in its home environment which keep it in bounds. However, nothing like

that prevents it from thriving in its adopted homeland. This is the major thrust of its control, to find natural and environmentally compatible controls in our environment without importing another problem. It seems it will be a while yet, but in the meantime we shall check tihs one out, since there is no dearth of experimental subjects at hand.

Down Through the Years with Driftwood

Twenty Years Ago

Driftwood, after 10 weeks of experiment, began to publish with five columns to a page. The format had been tried several weeks in the back portion of the paper and had met with favour from readers.

It was a dry August, reported Ganges weather-watcher Howard Carlin. Rainfall measured .8 inches but was more than the previous year's .62 inches. High temperature was 82 degrees and the thermometer registered a low of 46 degrees.

The ladies softball championship was postponed due to the long weekend. The Salt Spring ladies from Fulford and Ganges would vie for the Rose Bowl Championship on September 13.

The photograph showed a definite parking problem in Ganges. Residents of the island had gathered for a social occasion but had trouble finding space for their transportation. The photo had been taken at the turn of the century when the Iroquois docked and residents drove to the wharf with horses and

The golden anniversary party was being planned. The ladies of HMS Ganges Chapter IODE were set to celebrate the organization's 50 years of service to the Salt Spring community with a coffee party at the Golf Club.

The pastor to the Full Gospel Chapel on Salt Spring was leaving for a missionary tour of the western United States. Hazel McLean would be replaced at the chapel by Margaret Baker and June Ward who were on a furlough from their work in India.

The Pender Queen needed repairs and was taken out of service for a few days. The venerable Cr Peck was put to work as replacement.

Fifteen Years Ago

The provincial election results were reported and John Tisdalle would return to the legislature as the member for Saanich and the Islands. He defeated Don Johannessen of the New Democrats by close to 3,000 votes. The Social Credit would remain as the government, having won 39 seats to II for the NDP and five for the Liberals.

Contractors on Salt Spring were having difficulty arranging for concrete to be shipped to the island. Both the wharf at Crofton and the dock at Fulford had weight restrictions imposed on their use. The Crofton wharf had a limit of 10 tons while the Fulford ferry dock was limited to 20 tons. A fully loaded cement truck weighed in at 24 tons. The trucks were arriving with a half-load which boosted the price of concrete.



Papajohn reported from Saturna on the comings and goings of friends and neighbours. He had a house full of relatives and commented that the best thing about it was that by the time he got to use the bathroom, the seat was nice and warm.

The Canadian Nursing Foundation Scholarship had been awarded to Rose Murakami of Salt Spring. She was studying nursing at Montreal's McGill University for a master's degree and hoped to teach nursing after graduation.

The golfers from Nanaimo enjoyed a chicken barbecue and a team fun match. The meal was cooked by Robert Aston while Glen Stahl and Arthur Platt captained the two fun teams

The luau saw 12 hours of feasting. The Salt Spring Rotary sponsored the event and Ernie Lowe and Graham White organized it. The hungry islanders gathered at Lakeridge for the day.

B.C. Hydro crews were stringing power lines along the main road on Salt Spring to supplement service to the south end of the island. Among the crew were Stanley and Bob Moulton, Wilf Kitchen and Cyril Beech. The line would eventually reach the Outer Islands as well.

Ten Years Ago

A public hearing was set for Ganges to hear opposition to the proposed sewage outfall into the harbour. SPEC had protested issuance of the permit and the meeting was called for Mahon Hall. Ben Marr, deputy minister of water resources, would chair the meeting.

The boat and motor had an owner. Aage Villadsen of Ganges won the draw sponsored by the Salt Spring Lions Club. Money raised from the sale of tickets for the draw would go towards the sports complex planned by the Lions at Central.

The cougar had been killing sheep on Salt Spring. In slightly more than a week the big cat had killed 25 sheep. Ted Akerman, Merv Walde and Ben Greenhough of Fulford tracked the cougar and shot it.

Papajohn reported from Saturna that the Lions Club had decided to hold another evening of wood cutting under the direction of John Silvester. The club also named Art Ralph head of the greeters

The Galiano golfer beat the field in a four-day tournament held in Richmond on the mainland. Bill Cottrell, 80, won the Clyde Davis Rose Bowl for the 75-and-over golf

The Crofton ferry wharf was restricted to vehicles of less than 20 tons gross again. Cement trucks and other heavy vehicles would have to reach Salt Spring through Swartz

Bay and Fulford.

The Ganges plan, drawn up by the Salt Spring Planning Association. was printed by Driftwood. The plan took two years to draw up and comments on its contents were being sought.

The office of Ganges detachment RCMP had a new staff member. Eva Jorden assumed duties previously carried out by Debbie Wood. Cpl. Ray Stelter welcomed Jorden to her duties.

Five Years Ago

The log dump at Welbury Bay on Salt Spring should be reopened, said Ollie Dubois of Pacific Forest Products. The dump had been improved because repairs were needed, he said. Approximately three million board feet per year would be boomed at the site and up to 100 jobs on the island depended upon the use of the dump.

The B.C. Supreme Court ruled that work on the wharf at Bennett Bay on Mayne Island must stop. Justice J.G. Ruttan made the ruling. The wharf could be used by guests of the Mayne Inn, the justice ruled, but it could not be expanded. The Islands Trust was to seek a demolition order to have the expanded portion of the wharf removed.

The Anglican Parish on Salt Spring greeted the Rev. John Bailey. He arrived with wife Brenda to assume duties as parish priest. Bailey arrived from Toronto where he had been studying and had been involved in parish work. He had a Master of Divinity degree from Trinity College among other qualifications for the job.

Saturna Island was the scene of a meeting of the Gulf Islands branch of the B.C. Historical Association. Following a potluck lunch at the Community Hall, the group heard an address by Maria Tippet who talked about Emily Carr.

The teacherages were being rented for a low price and should be sold, said Pender school trustee John Zacharias. "We're losing money like it's going out of style," he told a meeting of the Gulf Islands School Board.

The salmon barbecue held by the Mayne Island Lions Club attracted more than 200 people. Club president John Halliday expressed thanks to all the volunteers who made the event a success. More than \$1,000 was raised to help the Lions in their community service projects.

There were 22 salmon weighed in at the Salt Spring Rotary salmon derby. Top prize of \$100 went to C. Watson for a 9 lb., 8 oz. fish. Catherine McFadyen took third spot and \$25 for a 7 lb., 7 oz. salmon, D.E. Smith of Fulford won the draw prize of \$500.
