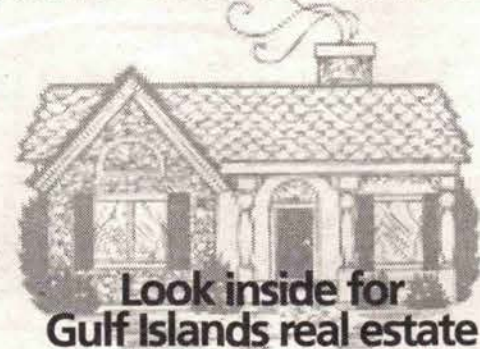

SCOTT HYLANDS 30 years in the public eye

Pulling the latch and stepping through the tall, wooden gate of actor Scott Hylands' Salt Spring home, the soul is immediately hushed.

A green-tiled and white stucco Spanish-style home sprawls lazily above a mossy stone patio and meandering wooden walkway that leads to the beach. The nearby road and the rest of the world disappear from sight and mind.

To the right of the home is a miniature house. And next to that are a sandbox and tire swing. The Hylands' home is a family home and family — wife Veronica Hylands and three-year-old daughter Rebecca — is now a driving force in Scott Hylands' life.

In many ways, the Hylands' Salt Spring home is a reprieve from the rest of the world: an escape from autograph seekers that meet them as they step off the plane in Toronto, a retreat from the takes and retakes of television filming, of auditions, stages and audiences. It is a haven — a good place — to raise Rebecca.

But on the other hand, the home is an antagonist in the Scott Hylands story. For as little as Hylands likes to blame locale on the "ebb and flow" of an acting career that has spanned the last 30 years, he acknowledges that to get the parts, one needs to be in the hub of things, "sitting on the balls of the feet" and ready to jump into a part.

"Unfortunately," Hylands says, "a lot happens in this business as a result of rubbing shoulders in the bar."

The need to be out there and hustle for parts prompted the Hylands to post a "for sale" sign on their house early last year. They have since taken it off the market, but realize their time here may be limited.

Born in Lethbridge and raised mostly in Vancouver, Hylands graduated from Shawnigan Lake School for boys. He says he was theatrical as a child and didn't shy away from practical jokes.

He participated in high school plays and realized early that he "knew how to assess an audience, and not over-play it" in a way that was beyond his years. He also found it was a good way to get a date.

Hylands graduated from the University of British Columbia in 1964 with a degree in theatre and English.

"If I wanted to be a gem cutter, I would have gone to where they cut gems."

Hylands went to New York.

In early 1965, he "was standing lucky when someone got hurt." In other words, he was understudy for the lead part in a stage production of Billy Liar, a very "current" production at the time. When the lead actor went down, Hylands took on the part and his career was launched.

He spent the next 20 years working in the United States, the bulk of that time being spent in Los Angeles. About half his work was in television and film, and half on the stage.

Unlike many actors, Hylands has never had to sponsor his acting career by working at something else.

The difference between film and stage is as great as right brain, left brain, Hylands says.

"I get more of a high from the theatre. If you feel in control it is very exhilarating. It can be terrifying if you feel yourself losing control."

Thirty years later, Hylands has done 200 television shows, 10 films, more than 50 plays and two television series. The most recent

At 20 years old, she had reached her career goal to work as a pediatric nurse at Toronto's Hospital for Sick Children. It was 1985 and she was earning \$35,000 a year. She had a suite on the 24th floor of a downtown Toronto apartment. Life was busy, life was good.

She had no time for the wait created by the television "cop show" being filmed in the lobby. And, burdened by groceries and a rising temper that matched her red hair, she remained unimpressed by the actor who approached her, and struck up a conversation.

series was the Global Can-West production *Destiny Ridge*, for which Hylands participated in seven shows. He describes *Destiny Ridge* as a "notion trying to find its feet — and now it has." One gathers he is not unhappy to be on the viewing side of the production.

His first series, the Canadian production *Night Heat*, left a veritable mark on his career. Hylands played the role of Detective Kevin O'Bryan, a part for which he is constantly recognized in Toronto where *Night Heat* replays still run. Hylands is generally known in the industry as a Toronto actor and many people are surprised to discover he lives on the west coast.

Which brings him back to the position in which he now finds himself — outside the mainstream.

"It is essentially detrimental to what I do. But in a sense, everyone has to adjust their ambition — it's a mere fact of living here. And I came over here to be a part of raising a family."

Later she had to look in the TV Guide and then call a girl friend to determine the name of the *Night Heat* actor she spoke to.

Thus began the romance that eventually led to marriage, a move to Salt Spring Island and the birth of now three-year-old Rebecca.

And life for Veronica Hylands is still busy, still good, but a little less predictable.

The couple's first dinner date took place during Scott Hylands' lunch hour — at 3 a.m. It had been an emotional day for Veronica. One of the children on her ward had died and she was unable to sleep. His call — the first since their meeting in the lobby — came at 2 a.m. A few minutes later she found herself up, showering and washing her hair.

That date evolved into more dates and eventually, Hylands invited her to his house.

"I had never seen anything like it. It was like stepping into an art deco magazine," she recalls. "The kitchen was a theatre!"

As the relationship developed, their age difference of 22 years caused some concern and they broke off the romance for a month before deciding to marry.

The two entered marriage seriously. Scott Hylands had witnessed a low survival rate for actors' marriages and seen many

children grow up without knowing their dads. Veronica Hylands agreed to put her career on hold, allowing the family to be together as frequently as possible.

Now, on longer "shoots," Hylands' family will usually join him on location. They have spent time in Calgary, Edmonton, Miami and the Bahamas, where he was involved in the filming of the CBC production, *The Scales of Justice*.

Mingling with the film crowd has been an education for Veronica Hylands, who describes some people as "very friendly" and others as "snobs."

She is still surprised at the number of women who "come on" to her husband even in her presence.

"They make comments right in front of me," she says, recalling an elevator ride after a wrap-up party in the Bahamas when an aspiring (she stresses the word) actress wearing "some slinky thing" made a very direct comment to her husband.

"But some of the women become really good friends and it's nice to develop that with someone who has a similar lifestyle."

Television viewing has taken on new proportions in Veronica Hylands' life. She admits to making a point of watching *Night Heat* after she met first met Scott Hylands and "getting all goose-pimply" when his character appeared.

Now, sitting alongside him and

Tributes honour Driftwood founder Woody Fisher

I knew Woody Fisher when he first decided to launch an island newspaper.

He ambled into the office at the Sidney Review to tell us of his plans.

Fisher was an escapee from the pressures of the American city scene, he explained. He wanted the quiet of the islands and found it on Tumbo Island, on Saturna and Galiano, and now on Salt Spring.

He had discovered his paradise here among the islands and he never lost his love for his haven of heaven. Long after he left the islands he was a regular visitor and property owner.

Last Spring he went fishing with his old crony Roy Lamont for

the last time. He didn't survive the trip.

It was a fitting end for a man who had found his paradise in the islands and the surrounding waters. He had long boasted that if he were to be reincarnated he would come back as a seagull.

Last fall Roy and Molly Lamont invited a gathering of Woody Fisher's friends to a wake. He didn't want a service. He wanted a

happy gathering to remember him with joy. And that is exactly what the wake accomplished.

The occasion also provided for the erection of a memorial tablet to the founder of the islands' newspaper. Firmly mounted on a huge rock at the Lamont home on Toynbee Road, is the memorial to a notable islander.

The location is appropriate because Roy Lamont was associ-

ated with Fisher in his Farm Tours business for a number of years.

When Fisher decided to spread his wings for a time, he sold Driftwood and moved east. After a taste of daily reporting, he joined the staff of Western Producer in marketing. The Fishers moved into an apartment in Saskatoon. The Lamonts were neighbours and they remained lifelong friends.

Lamont was a retired air force officer with a trophy and engraving business in the Saskatchewan city. After he and Molly had made their new friends welcome, it was a short step back to Salt Spring Island where Fisher had property and was host to his new friends.

A second tribute to Woody Fisher has been set up in the

expanded office of Driftwood. A small plaque commemorates the first issue of his Driftwood on March 24, 1960.

Arlene and Jim Ward acquired Driftwood from Fisher and published it until 1967, when Barbara Richards and I took it over. Tony Richards took over the newspaper in 1979.

Well-remembered, Fisher was no mere islander. He was an islander. The term is Scottish and was introduced to identify those residents of the Orkneys, the Shetlands and the Hebrides who had lived on more than one island.

And Woody Fisher well knew that the Scottish islands are not the only isles to have a tangle for the smelling.

watching actors perform, she is able to feel out which actors are "doing a good job, and which are just doing a job."

She can also tell when her husband is uncomfortable with a role, like the part of Jack Kilbourne, a scheming developer in the television series *Destiny Ridge*.

"I have a new scope when I watch things," she says. "And I still get goose bumps. I'm proud of him and I'm proud of his work."

One of her biggest thrills is sitting in a theatre, watching him perform on stage. She is generally alone and is able to listen to comments made around her.

"Once there were these two women, obviously on a 'ladies night out' and they were so hot for Scott they were making all these comments about him." She couldn't resist announcing she was married to him — but waited until near the end of the production so as to get the most out of their conversation.

But how does she feel watching her husband play an intimate role with another woman?

"It doesn't bother me," she says. "I've been there and seen all the cameramen, the make-up and the sound. It's like watching a crack on the wall ... it goes on and on, retake after retake."

Her more active part as an extra in one of Scott Hylands' recent feature films — *Free Fall*, scheduled for television release either this month or next — confirmed this concept.

Hylands plays a co-pilot called to leave his dying wife to come and fly a plane that eventually goes down.

In an opening scene, Scott Hylands' character is speaking on a portable telephone and carrying his daughter, whom film producers thought Rebecca could play. Veronica Hylands went to the set to be with Rebecca and wound up with the part of nanny. (It was decided she looked too young to be Scott Hylands' dying wife.)

"I was fit for wardrobe, they did hair and make-up ... and I really looked like I was 17 again."

In the scene, Veronica Hylands comes down the stairs with another little girl, takes Rebecca from her husband, and exits into a back room. The camera then swings without breaking to view the dying wife. Veronica Hylands and the two children had to be extremely quiet after their exit — not an easy task for a three-year-old.

The seven takes on this one "little scene" took four hours to film. Needless to say, the tired and agitated child Rebecca became certainly added to the desired stress of the scene, whether or not it helped

Veronica Hylands' stress level.

For their efforts, Veronica and Rebecca Hylands each received separate \$50 cheques.

Living with a "recognized" figure has brought some memorable moments to Veronica Hylands' life.

The family is immediately accosted by autograph seekers at the Toronto airport, and she is very aware of people who do "double takes" as they walk down the street. Parents often send their children over for autographs in restaurants and some people can't quite get it right.

"Are you a politician in Surrey?"

"Ah, you do the weather on TV."

"Didn't you play in *The Heat of the Night*?"

(To Veronica) "Don't you work in my doctor's office?"

Fan letters are also fun and her job is to answer them, although Scott Hylands does read them and signs the black and white pictures that accompany the response.

Most are from women, she notes, many of whom have followed his entire career.

And while Scott Hylands' acting career has been long and varied, it was the role of *Night Heat's* Detective Kevin O'Bryan that brought him into the apartment lobby of an unimpressed red-head, who maybe after all, has a tender affinity for "cop shows."

The support of the Driftwood is also much appreciated, particularly the cartoon portraying such youthful looking volunteers. Those who come in frequently will notice the volunteers range in age from 12 to 80. Admittedly, the latter end of the scale predominates.

Normally one approaches the reference section with a specific topic in mind. However, the enthusiasm of the reference book buyer, June Perry, is so infectious that the idea of spending a few moments just browsing in this section becomes very enticing.

Try it, you may like it. I did! There is a nice big table there, just what is needed for perusing the likes of the heaviest (weightwise) of the new acquisitions - The

Geological Atlas of the Western Sedimentary Basin - a truly comprehensive volume complete with graphs and charts to delight any geologist.

Also in the scientific mode we have The Academic Press Dictionary of Science and Technology. The Master IC Cook Book has nothing whatever to do with things culinary, but is about electronics for professionals and hobbyists alike, and joins other books on electronics, including The Art of Electronics.

One of the most popular sections deals with medical matters. New in this area is the updated CPS or Compendium of Pharmaceuticals and Specialties which will help clear up any mystery about drugs in use today, and The School of Natural Healing.

Animals are not forgotten - A Merck Veterinary Manual is included.

For the literary ((both producer

and consumer) there is the 1995 Writers' Market, the market guide to the Pacific North West and The Columbia Granger's Index to Poetry which includes both first and last line indexes for easy access. The Encyclopedia of Word and Phrase Origins will amuse trivialists for hours. For example, "hunky dory" may have come from Hunkidori - a breath freshener introduced in 1868.

Doesn't that whet your appetite? If not, how about The Book of Lists? This one is great for settling arguments. It has lists of the largest lakes, highest waterfalls and even the names of 13 American lawyers who never went to law school.

Computer experts and would-be experts will be delighted to find Real Time Programming which reveals all you need to know to qualify as an expert in 184 pages.

Canadian Grants and Assistance, the 1994 Complete

Guide to Universities and Career Directions are all there to assist those struggling to find their places in the job market and the world today.

There is so much more - The Lemonade Used Car Guide for 1995, the 1995 Tide Tables, the Canadian Who's Who (the proper one), the updated Law Students' Legal Advice Manual and on and on.

And don't forget the Vertical File which houses material which has a limited time of interest, or is simply too small to be on the regular shelves. Government material, special interest group material (such as the SSI Ecosystem Stewardship Project) may be located in here.

Once again one of the island's master craftsmen has donated time and skills for the benefit of the library. Bruce Kirwin's beautiful display case will be used to house treasures that need to be locked

under glass.

Due to popular demand, the hours of the Saturday Book Sale will be extended, running from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. every Saturday. Please keep the books coming, they are a wonderful gift. But, please, at the risk of boring you as well as myself to death, once again, no old text books, there is no market for them.

The actual meeting will begin at 3:30 p.m. Everyone is welcome to come, but only members of the association may vote. WATERGATE CAKE WITH COVER-UP ICING

One box of white cake mix
3/4 cup oil
3 eggs
1 cup 7-Up
2 packages instant pistachio pudding mix

WHAT'S COOKING

1 cup flaked coconut
2 envelopes Dream Whip
1-1/2 cups cold milk

Blend cake mix, eggs, oil and 7-Up until moistened, then beat at medium speed for two minutes. Fold in one package of pistachio pudding mix, one cup chopped pecans and 1/2 cup coconut. Pour into a greased and floured tube pan and bake for about one hour at 350°.

Prepare Dream Whip and milk

according to package directions, but whip only until foamy. Add the second package of pistachio pudding and whip until the consistency of stiff whipped cream. Fold in the remaining pecans and coconut. This is the cover-up icing, which will be over an inch thick. You might want to halve the icing ingredients.

This cake is the pinnacle of junk food, with scarcely any redeeming nutritional value. Notice that even the liquid, instead of plain water or wholesome milk, is 7-Up. Unfortunately, however, as is the case with so much junk food, the taste is addictive.

The cost is about \$9, mostly in the pecans.

Churchill tribute made front page

Thirty years ago

January 29, 1965

A tribute to former British Prime Minister Winston Churchill, who died January 25 at 90 years of age, was published on the front page of the Driftwood.

"This man has left an indelible mark on the pages of history and will long be remembered for many contributions made to human progress In 1939 with matchless oratory he was able to whip the spirit of the almost beaten Allied Europe to new, shining effort and, having done this, he provided the military know-how to lead the way to ultimate and complete victory."

Twenty-five years ago

January 29, 1970

Saanich and the Islands MLA John Tisdalle agreed with Galiano residents that road crews were clearing too wide a path for roads on that island. Residents asked that the current 60-foot road requirement be eased when such roads are not necessary. Tisdalle also criticized the practice of clearing a wide swath for the road and then paving only a narrow section in the middle. He described this as a "scorched

earth" policy.

"The crews should use discretion and where it is possible, leave the greenery on either side," he suggested.

Twenty years ago

January 29, 1975

The Salt Spring subdivision bylaw was to go before a public meeting February 10, after extensive changes by the planners of the Capital Regional District. The new bylaw had been intended to follow the Official Community Plan on Salt Spring but an inability to draw up a bylaw to meet the provision for an average-sized lot threw it out of sequence.

Fifteen years ago

January 30, 1980

The Salt Spring Island Chamber of Commerce struck a committee to examine the activities of regional director Yvette Valcourt. The committee was charged with examining Valcourt's statements and actions since her election. Terry Elford said the committee needed to examine the rift between the upper and lower Ganges village and the continuing discord arising from the sewer debate.

Meanwhile, Valcourt told the regional board that Salt Spring

residents wanted to opt out of the transit area. She pointed out islanders do not have the benefit of bus service and should not be expected to contribute to the cost of transit in the regional district.

Ten years ago

January 23, 1985

Hundreds turned out January 19 for the official opening of the new Island Savings Credit Union building in Ganges. Jack Webster spoke and cut the ribbon. Also on hand for the opening was Cecil, the Island Savings robot.

Five years ago

January 24, 1990

Capital Regional District technical advisor Mike Williams expressed opposition to a new landfill site on Salt Spring, following a proposal by the solid waste management group for a curbside pick-up and a recycling program. At the time, the CRD was paying Laidlaw \$34,000 to remove trash off the island but that money could be used to support a local recycling program. The cost of a recycling program was projected at \$111,000 annually. Solid waste committee member Rick Laing projected the recycling program could decrease waste on the island by 30 to 50 per cent.

Parents Together group proposed

Introduction to a self-help support program for parents experiencing conflict with their teens is scheduled for Monday, February 13.

Parents Together is described as a "pragmatic approach to daily living that offers a new way to look at your situation, with support and encouragement to follow through with your plans for change."

The program is offered to parents of children

aged 12 and older. An information session this Monday from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. at the John Fidler Youth and Family Centre behind the Community Services Centre will determine the feasibility of starting a Parents Together group on Salt Spring.

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Ratepayers aim to heal island torn apart by issues

Important on the Galiano Ratepayers' agenda during 1994 was to meet with other island organizations and attempt to determine their outlook on common problems.

Through meetings with Trust members, government ministers and island householders, the fledgling organization hoped to begin the healing process deemed necessary in a community torn apart by environmental and development issues.

In her year-end report, president Irene Frith listed some of the ratepayers' many initiatives, ranging from a meeting with B.C. Ferries, to a talk with local man Andrew Loveridge on the future of South Galiano's Heritage Park.

Over the past year board members Jack Ford and Frank Hillier have been active members of the "Water Resources Study" which began work in 1994. At the meeting the two expressed concern about the study group's focus on only ground water, feeling that a community in trouble should be exploring the possible collection of surface water as well.

Ford pointed out that a lack of

ground water in some areas of the island was noted in a government survey done in 1982, and that nothing has been done about it. The close to 300 properties in the Sturdies Bay, Whaler Bay and Cain Point areas, he reported, are annually using 10 times the amount of ground water replaceable through winter rains.

A proposal to look into the feasibility of surface water collection in this heavily built-up part of the island might, Ford suggested, be undertaken by the ratepayers association. Matching funds are apparently available for such a study from the provincial government and the Capital Regional District.

The idea for a ratepayers-sponsored surface water study will be further discussed by the executive and brought forward to the membership for approval before any further action is taken.

A request was made later in the meeting for the ratepayers to make a study of property taxes and assessments in view of massive increases experienced by landowners here over the last three years - up to 145 per cent since 1992 for one Montague Harbour couple.

GALIANO NOTES

Two bylaw amendments were passed at the meeting, a third set aside for further study. The latter would have created associate memberships for long term renters, something some present found difficulty with, since the organization is "dedicated to the protection of the rights of property owners."

The two amendments passed dealt with "housekeeping" matters, one creating the possibility for the naming of honorary life memberships, the second setting the number of positions on the executive at 12: a president, a vice president, a secretary, a treasurer and eight directors.

The Ratepayers "Irish Night" will be held in the Galiano School Activity Centre, not as announced previously at the Lions Club Park Centre.

The date is Saturday, March 18, the cost \$20. Supper will be roast beef with all the trimmings and an evening of fun and fellowship will follow.

Amateur entertainment is promised plus dancing and a fun auction of donated items. It is hoped funds raised through the auction will make possible the purchase of needed equipment for Galiano's newly built ambulance centre.

Survey of purchasers of property

Galiano's NRS Realty has recently done a study of who buys property on the island and whether they purchase for investment or development. The results of the study are as interesting as the reasons for purchase are varied.

Analysis of the company's 1994 sales determined that the majority of purchasers were aged 40 to 60 and have their principle residence in the lower mainland. The study also noted that 15 per cent of buyers purchased property only for investment while 23 per cent intend to become full time residents within the next five years. Sixty-two per cent purchased "a weekend retreat" with plans to increase occupancy over the years to come.

A diagram included with this information shows that, along

with the 62 per cent lower mainland buyers, 10 per cent of the total reside on Vancouver Island, nine per cent in other provinces and two per cent are from overseas. Seventeen per cent are already residents of the Gulf Islands.

Dandelion Gallery goes black and white

Galiano's Dandelion Gallery has been closed for about two weeks. During this period members of the cooperative have been busy with scrubbing brushes and paint rollers, and all is now ready for their first show of the year.

As their opening show for 1995, the members are hanging a "black and white" show. The exhibit will open on Friday, February 10. A re-opening celebration will be held at the gallery on February 11 at 7:30 p.m. All are welcome.
