Easter Vestry Meetings will be held at St. Mary's Church, April 10th, 8:30 p.m.; St. Mark's Church, April 11th, 7:30 p.m., for the purpose of electing Church Wardens and other officers for the ensuing year.

Mr. Hutt, whose family have property near Ryde, in the Isle of Wight, has been paying a visit to the Island, and is so charmed with its scenery, climate, position, etc., that he is returning to England with serious thoughts of coming back to make his home here.

Mr. C. W. Tolson, wife and baby, and Miss Gibbs, have been paying a short visit to the Island, and were warmly received by their many friends. During their stay they were guests at their old house at Ganges Harbour, which is now the property of Mr. Leonard Tolson.

It is hoped that the various members of each family will contribute, and as soon as possible after Easter the envelopes will be collected and the names and amounts entered on the subscription list.

The lowest the thermometer has been this winter was 22°, Nov. 28th. There has been scarcely any snow.

There have been fifteen deaths registered in the Church of England registry book in the past four years, of which three were the result of accident; five, old age; three, infants; four, women after child-birth. None were from epidemic or other sickness.
