



Project reaches completion

Light comes to powerless Pender people

They've seen the light at Wal-

Last week saw the last line strung through the Neptune-Wallace Point project to bring power to the isolated community at the end of the road.

The road is nearly four miles

long. It is also many years long. The residents of Wallace Point, which is also termed Trincomali, have been pressing for power for nearly 10 years. But they were caught in a squeeze.

Wallace Point was already populated when the provincial government began looking closely at lot sizes in the islands.

The road to Wallace Point ran through the Neptune subdivision, which was already on the drawing boards a decade ago. But, although the subdivision was clear in the minds of its developers, it was not evident to the provincial government. As a result, the subdivision was not recognized when the 10-acre freeze came into being. Neither was the road which gave access to Wallace Point.

The owners of property at Wallace Point were cut off from the rest of the island when the 10-acre freeze came into force. The road was a private route and the property through which it ran provided no public access.

The Wallace Point residents gained an injunction to keep the road open, but there was still no







Weather was greener in 1933 reports observer for islands

November turned out to be a rather nicer month than one normally expects, reports Walter Hunt-Sowrey, Dominion weather observer at Mayne. Detailed report is as

It gave us quite a fair rainfall, with ground saturation around the 28th, when my creek began to run again.

We also had two periods of mostly clear and frosty weather, pleasant, but killing as far as flowers were concerned.

After a period of rather heavier precipitation than usual, we are once more back to our long-time average in rainfall.

These variations are quite visible when one drops a tree for the winter wood. The annular rings on the wood show these variations very clearly, as well as the difference between summer and winter growth. Looking back over the years, our very equable climate on this coast is very visible, even if the odd year does give rather heavier variations than usual.

For instance, in 1933 we had a very heavy snowfall in October, and a green winter after that.
