More than 200 participants join work party in three locations

The softball-baseball work party at Salt Spring last Thursday was a major success with over 200 people taking part in three locations.

Sponsored by the recreation commission and the school district, the project brought together the majority of the 35 teams and groups that use the seven existing diamonds on the island.

In Ganges almost 150 people worked on the four diamonds while at Portlock Park over 50 people were involved. Fulford was the only

major disappointment where a failure to communicate and a lack of co-operation resulted in very little being accomplished.

An incredible number of participants volunteered not only themselves but also their expertise and their equipment. This was particularly evident in Ganges with machinery and manpower everywhere.

The layout for the diamonds were done by Roland Temmel of Hardie and Associates Land Surveyors with help from Pat Lockert and Kevin McCarthy. Mark Hughes did

the rototilling on all the fields with Peter Price of the school district helping direct traffic and run the district tractor.

Jim Walsh of Gulfwind Construction did the levelling and backhoe work on the elementary and Hydro diamonds.

Over on the little league Bruce Mailey and Pat Lockert of G.A.S.-Driftwood and Lee-Anne Gordon of Driftwood Dazzling Derelicts coordinated the infield work. The Slug fast-pitch and slow-pitch team painted the dugouts and repaired the fence. The Slugs were directed by Peter Huser, Ron Moger and head Slug Scott Bergstrom.

The area behind the outfield fence was a hive of activity as Langdons Loggers embarked upon a major brush clearing job. Charlie Byron on cat and Paul Smith on backhoe led the attack with Dennis Howard and Barry Walker acting as supervisors.

The Hydro diamond underwent the biggest changes. The infield was completely rebuilt, backstop repaired and upgraded. The Hydro crew under the direction of Larry Davies cleared with bush support by the Gangrene team. Work on the infield was done by the Dirty Old Guys, the Raunchy Boy Club Jellyfish, the Super-Soccos, and the Fernwood Knights. Byron's Babes partially painted the backstop while Pauline and Rick of Devon Lodge fixed the backstop screen and provided the water hoses.

The field really benefitted from the capable rolling job done by Albert Kaye. A number of people volunteered their trucks, including Bill Anderson, Sally Rimmer, Glenn Woodley, Devon Lodge and John Pickering.

On the elementary diamond the layout and rototilling were completed before dark. Rolling and watering is still required. All diamonds need regular watering as well as liming and raking.

This year the men's league is raking the diamonds before each game and I might suggest that this be done by all teams before each home game.

At Portlock the project was coordinated by Bruce McFadyen of the recreation commission, Coley Byron of Harbour House, Alvin Ryckman of Vesuvius and Rob Tranter of little league. It was nice to see so many of the little league players out, coached by Pat Akerman and Rob Tranter, as well as the boys' team that plays in the ladies' league.

Fulford was a bit of a disappointment, with only two men turning up along with the Fulford Ladies' team. Hopefully the groups who didn't participate, namely the two Fulford slow-pitch teams, the Fulford Boomers and the Fulford minor softball, will see fit to complete the necessary work at the Fulford Ball Park's two diamonds.

In conclusion, I would like to personally thank all the participants. We must realize that the recreation commission and the school district will never be able on their own to look after the ball fields. The players and teams must

help look after the fields.

Salt Spring actors schedule plays

The Salt Spring Players have selected their program of plays for the 1983-1984 season.

The plays chosen, in order of intended production, are:

The Effects of Gamma Rays on Man-in-the-Moon Marigolds, *Play It Again, Sam*, *Deathtrap* and *Royal Gambit*.

The Effect of Gamma Rays on Man-in-the-Moon Marigolds, written by Paul Zindel, will be produced the first week in October. This powerful and moving study of an embittered, vindictive widow and her two young daughters has been hailed as one of the most significant and affecting plays of our time.

As the younger daughters engage in a school experiment on the effect of gamma rays on man-in-the-moon marigolds, it proves something beautiful and full of promise can emerge from even the most barren, afflicted soil.

This is the timeless lesson of the play and the root of its moving power and truth. The cast requirements are: two women, one approximately 40 and one older and three teenage girls.

Play It Again, Sam, written by Woody Allen, will be produced at the end of November. Our homely hero has this "thing" about Humphrey Bogart. Homely heroes being in short supply, Bogey comes to the rescue, with a fantastic bevy of beauties.

It's a tough life, making it in the

world of beautiful people, but it is a great love and laugh fable, with a surprising amount of wistful appeal. Cast requirements are: Two males about 30 and Bogey; two females of approximately 30 and six, the bevy of beauties.

Deathtrap, written by Ira Levin, will be produced at the end of February, 1984. This ingeniously constructed play offers a rare and skilful blending of two priceless theatrical ingredients—gasp-inducing thrills and spontaneous laughter. It is a classic thriller, with a style, a manner and an audience of its own; an audience that will be enthralled to the final moments of the play. The cast requirements are: Three males, about 50, mid 20's and mid 50's, and two females, one in her 40's and one early 50's.

Royal Gambit, written by Hermann Gressieker (translated and adapted by George White) will be produced in April, 1984. It delineates the relationship of King Henry VIII and the six women of his life.

Henry remains the same throughout, but the women progress in dress and thought right up to modern times. The theme transcends history and Gressieker presents us with a Henry who is the epitome of renaissance man and with a conclusion "that the 20th century is the dead-end of humanism." The cast requirements are: one male, 40, Henry and six

females (Katirana of Aragon, Anne Boleyn, Jane Seymour, Anna of Cleves, Kathryn Howard and Kate Parr).

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Squash court proposal explained at meeting

Squash and racquetball enthusiasts at Salt Spring Island were given an alternative plan last week at a meeting at the Harbour House Hotel, under the direction of hotel owner Bob Wanless.

Wanless invited squash and racquetball players to discuss the construction of one squash court, one racquetball court and a jacuzzi at the Harbour House.

"I'm not trying to compete with the already existing proposal for squash and racquetball courts," Wanless explained. He added that the hotel already had facilities for the courts in that there was plumbing and an area suitable for

their construction.

Wanless explained that there were three ways of paying for the courts. One could hold an executive membership for \$700. A class A membership would be a one-year, non-transferrable membership for \$300 or a pay-as-you-play fee would cost \$6 per game.

The courts would be open 18 hours a day and reservations would be taken at the hotel front desk.

Wanless explained that he needed 50 executive memberships before he could obtain a development and building permit and go ahead with construction.

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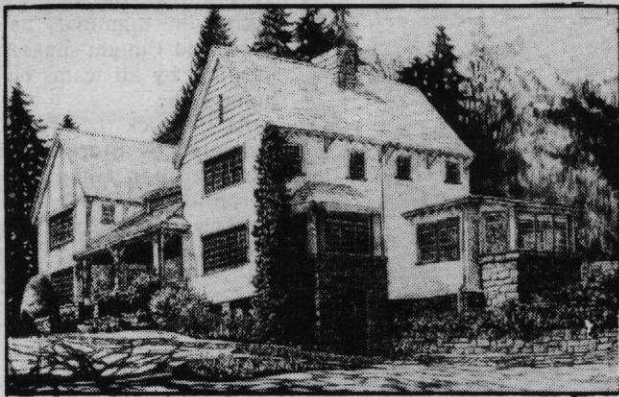

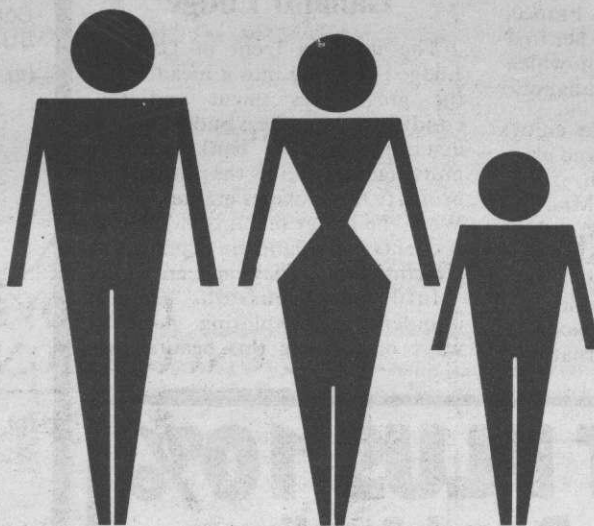

Weekly market provides outlet for local produce

Every Friday morning the South Galiano Community Hall is the scene of a market which is one port of call on the weekly shopping round, which includes the Corner Store, Burrill Brothers and the Deli.

The market, which is presently run by Katrina Boese, provides an outlet for local produce: Jocelyn sells fresh eggs, Mike Hoebel sells lettuce and other garden produce, Peter Rabatich retails salmon and cod from his truck, Debbie Mann sells tofu; besides which fresh vegetables, fruit, dried goods, cheese, bread and honey are brought in by the operators.

The market ends at noon, so when a *Driftwood* reporter arrived at 2 pm there were no pictures to take, and any negotiations she heard were completely unrelated to the public use of the market.

Galiano shoppers are probably quite tolerant of four-letter words and are unlikely to allow these to deprive them of a social occasion, which for several years they have regarded as a pleasant interlude in the weekly round.

Garden Club

A sharing of ideas with one's fellow man leads to an enriched life. This is particularly true of Galiano gardeners. Members of the Garden Club spent a pleasant and profitable afternoon recently visiting, in addition to the Galiano garden described in last week's *Driftwood*, Frank and Mary Reader's garden which they are carving out of rocky terrain on Shopland Road.

Space under their deck has been enclosed and turned into a garden workshop. Joe and Florrie Fleming, like the Readers, lived many years in Africa, and spent their first two years here becoming familiar with the very different climate of West Coast Canada.

Joe, who is a retired mining engineer, has devised an ingenious underground watering system to make it possible for him to grow vegetables in his dry, sandy soil.

Jessie Bellhouse, enthusiastic gardener for many years in the Burrill Road area, specializes in shrubs and potted plants, so it was a fitting end to a delightful tour to feast one's eyes on the many-clustered pale mauve blossoms of her wisteria and be refreshed by afternoon tea served on her sundeck overlooking Bellhouse Bay.

International
Exchange

An exchange of ideas is especially valuable between people of different countries. At least seven Galiano people have visited China in the past year, the latest being Fred and

Margaret Robson who returned only last week.

Most Western visitors to China go on organized and conducted tours, but Connie Kennedy, who spoke to and showed slides to Galiano school children last week, chose to travel freely with her friend Louis Gautier, organizing their own journeys and accommodation.

In this way Connie and Louis, armed with a few lessons of basic Chinese, travelled long distances by train or boat, avoiding Western-style hotels and food and had to observe the way Chinese people live and how this differs from the Canadian way of life.

Other islanders have been most fortunate to gain knowledge of Chinese people through having them as guests here on Galiano. This last week Bau Fang Li came to Galiano for four days as a brief interlude in her busy life as a research worker at Simon Fraser University.

Bau Fang has been a research scientist since she graduated from university 20 years ago. She is married to a fellow researcher in a science institute in Peking and has two children, a 14-year-old son and a seven-year-old daughter. In China she works six days a week from 8 am until 6 pm as well as doing the household chores which she shares with her husband.

She travels to work by bus but for attending meetings there is a chauffeur-driven institute car. She has also travelled extensively in China by plane and train attending meetings and in the course of her work.

Bau Fang learned Russian as her second language, and only began to study English about six months before she arrived in Canada last October. She is doing research on semi-conductors in the physics department under Dr. Roy Morrison who is at present attending a convention in France, allowing Bau Fang to take her first Canadian vacation, half of which she decided to spend on Galiano.

Like all island guests she enjoys the tranquility and beauty and plans to return whenever she can.

A most fitting date for Mrs. Li's next visit would be Friday, July 1, when the North Galiano Community Association will stage their big event of the summer, the Canada Day Jamboree which this year will have a strong international

flavour with flags, costumes and dances from other countries.

The Jamboree has become noted for its excellent displays. This year convener Alistair Ross is appealing to Galiano photographers, amateur and professional, to send him at their earliest convenience six to 12 of their favourite prints, four by six inches or larger, in colour or black and white, to display on July 1.

Bluff Park

Bluff Park, a subject so often charged with emotion and misconception, deserves a visit. Like a beautiful woman changing a dress, the park has put on a fresh selection of wildflowers for our enjoyment.

The slope below the cliff top is covered with lychnis, a member of the campion family with crimson flowers and pale green foliage. At the top of the bluff the brilliant rose umbels of Hooker's onion form a carpet.

Similar in shape, the single blue flowers of *Brodiaea* are scattered among them. Conspicuous among the selection of yellow flowers is the daisy-like woolly sunflower.

Galiano Lodge

The lawn in front of Galiano Lodge is turning into a meadow as the grass goes uncut and the condition of the buildings is deteriorating. The bank holds a mortgage which puts the price of the property far above its market value. While the Lodge remains unsold the residents of Galiano are deprived of a facility which they once enjoyed.

Informal discussions among islanders are exploring possible ways of reviving this beautifully-

sited hostelry. One idea that is being talked about is for a group of local investors to co-operate in purchasing and operating the Lodge. Another suggestion is to split the property into two or three more financially-manageable parcels.

Any proposals are only at the conversational stage and action would depend on complicated legal negotiations and the willingness of the bank and any other mortgage holders to cut their losses and put the property on the market at a reasonable price.

NOTICE is hereby given that all persons who deem their interest in property affected by the following proposed By-laws will be afforded an opportunity to be heard on the matters contained therein at a Public Hearing to be held in the South Galiano Community Hall, Sturdies Bay Road, Galiano Island, on **FRIDAY, JUNE 17, 1983** commencing at 6:30 p.m.

(a) Proposed Galiano Island Trust Committee By-law No. 29 (being Amendment By-law No. 1, 1983), is a By-law to amend Galiano Island Trust Committee By-law No. 5, 1978, cited as "Zoning By-law, Galiano Island and Area, 1978".

The purpose of the By-law is to rezone part of Lot A, Plan 19389, except Plans 28918 and 29196, District Lot 3, Galiano Island, as shown on the map attached to the proposed By-law, from the Rural 1 Zone to the Commercial 1 Zone, subject to the following condition: that the subject property not be used for either automobile service stations or motor vehicle sales.

The By-law also designates the above described property as a development permit area.

(b) Proposed Galiano Island Trust Committee By-law No. 30 (being Amendment By-law No. 2, 1983), is a By-law to amend Galiano Zoning By-law No. 5, 1978.

The purpose of the By-law is to add a new zoning classification to be known as the "Commercial 3 (C3) Zone". This zone will provide for the following uses: neighbourhood public houses (with Class D liquor licenses); restaurants and cafes; a residential use combined with any of the above listed uses.

The By-law also proposes to rezone part of Lot 2, Plan 13798, District Lot 3, Galiano Island, shown on the map attached to the By-law, from the Rural Residential Zone to the Commercial 3 Zone and designates the property as a development permit area.

(c) Proposed Galiano Island Trust Committee By-law No. 31 (being Amendment By-law No. 3, 1983) is a By-law to amend Galiano Zoning By-law No. 5, 1978.

The purpose of the By-law is to correct an error in the legal description of the following property which is designated as a development permit area: Lot 1, District Lot 33, Plan 15378, Galiano Island.

Copies of the proposed By-laws may be reviewed in the Post Office lobby, Galiano Island, during any hour of the day, Monday to Saturday inclusive. Island farm uses geese to keep weeds down

Brian and Edie Watt's Chinese weeder geese have cleaned out the weeds and left them with a healthy berry patch this year at their Beaver Point farm.

The Chinese weeder geese work between the berry plant rows and even on the rows themselves where grass and weeds emerge. The three-quarter acre strawberry patch at the Watts' Stillmeadow Farm is being weeded by the geese.

The weeding of the half-acre of raspberry plants is half finished by a cluster of eight seven-week-old weeder geese. The geese have saved the Watts money and energy and for the first year out of four, Edie Watt won't be spending entire days on her knees weeding the large commercial garden.

After hearing an old American farmer, named Grampa Wright, discuss the Chinese geese on CBC Radio one morning last winter, the Watts became interested in the birds. They hoped to save some of the money they'd spent on labour to weed their garden and also maintain an organic farm that could successfully harvest a crop without costing money.

Sales dropped after sprays introduced

The Watts agreed to pay part of geese-breeder Grampa Wright's export licence fee in order to bring the geese into Canada. Grampa Wright, a goose-breeder of 35 years, told the Watts that he used to ship thousands of weeder geese into Canada before chemical sprays went on the market and farmers switched over to non-organic production. Since then, export sales have diminished and Wright hasn't sold geese to Canadian farmers for years.

The geese grow to only a third of the size of regular geese. Because of their small size, they can step on the strawberry plants without crushing blossoms, berries or damaging the plant in any way.

When the geese are young, they are fed the weeds straight from the garden to develop a taste for them.

"Grampa Wright sold several weeder geese to an onion grower in Washington a while ago," Edie explained. "The farmer fed the goslings table scraps so that when they were put out to weed, they ate his entire onion crop."

Early dietary training is imperative in the development of weed-eating taste buds in the Chinese goose. A goose's ability to distinguish between weeds and cultivated crops comes as a result of both a Darwinian evolutionary pattern and learned behaviour.

"There is one weed that the geese don't eat because I didn't feed them

enough when they were small," Edie observed.

The geese can be used with onions, corn, nearly all berries, asparagus, herbs, tobacco and potato crops.

The geese are enthusiastic workers

The geese are enthusiastic workers. The clean-picked, net-covered strawberry patch, with its recently installed irrigation system, contains hundreds of strawberry plants with newly ripened berries. Eight or nine weeder geese huddle between the rows chewing all that isn't strawberry and working frantically between rests.

Last year, it took Edie Watt an hour to weed a row of strawberries. The Watts spent over \$1,000 on labour costs alone to keep the berry patches weeded. If they had used herbicides and pesticides on the crop it would have cost them a mere \$100. But for the Watts, the choice to grow organically came from a

general aversion to the many applications of chemicals in the agricultural industry.

Once chemicals are used it takes years before the area under cultivation will resume its natural balance of organisms.

Strawberries are prone to a variety of predators including mites, fruitworms, root weevils and spittlebugs. Each different variety of bug is killed off by a different pesticide. In addition to fighting bugs in the strawberry patch, there are weeds to contend with which reduce the nutrient content within the soil.

Different herbicides are used to deal with different weeds and as Brian Watt explained, the cumulative effect of the pesticides with each other and with herbicides is unknown.

"The same spray that kills one harmful bug kills the ladybug that

killed something else," Brian Watt explained. "Checks and balances are kept by insects but once one variety of insect is destroyed then things get out of hand."

Production higher than average

Last year the Watt's raspberry production was higher than provincial averages. They used no chemicals and were told by raspberry farmers that it couldn't be done without them.

But using chemicals to begin with, the farmer gets locked in, Brian said. He has to continue to use the chemicals because with the destruction of one type of insect, unusually high numbers of other insects result.

The Watts have already sold 2,000 pounds of strawberries to islanders this year. They will be selling to health food stores where the buyer is more conscious of purchasing an organically grown food and will pay more for that additional cost of cultivation.

But while the geese are busy in the berry rows, the grass grows high in the asparagus patch where Edie will send the geese for their next job. In addition to weeding, the weeder geese lay large breakfast eggs and make a

good Christmas dinner.

"The geese eat seven pounds of grass and leave behind two pounds of manure a day," Edie added.

And they don't cost a thing to feed.

Members of the transportation committee intend to use the results as a basis of talks with the ferry company regarding service to Salt Spring.

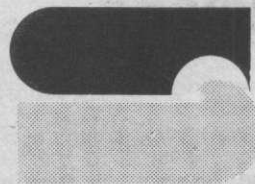

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Emerald Isle 22

Locally-designed sailboat launched

The new two-master seen in Fulford Harbour is unusual in at least one respect—the vessel is only 22 feet in length.

The sailboat, built by Emerald Isle Construction, was launched last week. A four-man team built the boat in five months with design time of one month before that.

Rice Elkington led the work crew in building the vessel which he designed. Others involved were James Scarf, Rick Boylen and Jeremy Lake.

The Emerald Isle 22 displaces 1,500 pounds and can cruise at five knots. It is 22 feet in length with a seven-foot beam and draws only one foot of water with the centreboard raised but four feet with the board lowered.

The vessel has three sails, the main, a jib and a mizzen. Power also comes from an outboard motor located in an inboard well at the stern.

Elkington said the design is based on a traditional Scandinavian vessel combined with an English design known as a Drascombe boat.

It features a modern concept of multi-chines, which are angles in the hull. The shape, said Elkington, allows the vessel to ride better and affords extra strength to the hull.

The hull and sail configuration are adaptable to allow for a number of different set-ups.

Inside the cabin, a vee-birth in the bow will sleep two with sufficient room to set up a modest galley. The boat also features a toilet.

Elkington, a native of the Kootenays, came to Salt Spring about 10 years ago. He spent some time in New Zealand before deciding to make the island home.

The sailboat moves well in light air, he noted, and can tack in under 80 degrees. The adjustable centreboard and subsequent

shallow draft allows the boat to be pulled up on a beach.

The vessel was constructed under contract for a Fulford resident but Emerald Isle will build another one. Elkington said the experience of the crew would allow them to build "just about anything for anybody."

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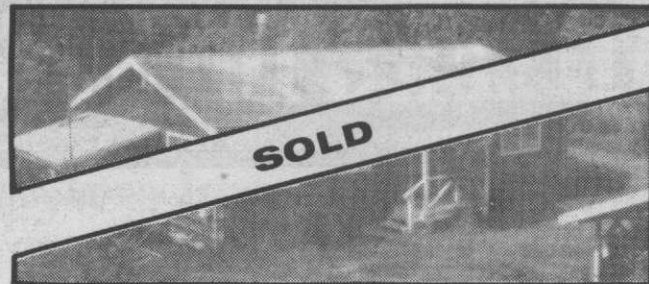

Twenty years ago

The summer ferry schedule had been released and showed a time saving of 10 minutes for the two-hour and 25-minute ride from Long Harbour to the mainland. The *Queen of the Islands* would make two return trips each day to Tsawwassen while the *Pender Queen* would carry travellers between Gulf Islands.

Plans for a boat basin in Ganges were given a boost when the federal government announced that \$165,000 had been set aside for the project. The next step would be the awarding of a contract, for construction.

The Fathom Phantoms of Salt Spring are finally successful in their search for the sunken coal barge off Wallace Island. The divers located the *Panther* in 40 feet of water off Panther Point on the island.

The Victoria City Yacht Club were pleased with their recent visit to Salt Spring and decided to change the date of the fleet captain's cruise to coincide with Pirate Days on the island.

Fifteen years ago

Ganges RCMP were investigating several cases of alleged assault. The police were checking into complaints that youths had had their hair cut by force.

Berry pickers were wanted in Victoria. The notice went out that Canada Manpower was seeking people to pick strawberries. The commercial season for the berries was approaching and help was needed to pick them.

Runners and jumpers from Saturna School took top place in the Outer Island track and field meet held on that island. More than 82 pupils from the schools on the Outer Islands took part in the events.

The Galiano Club cleaned up the community hall on that island. The workers painted and cleaned as well as planted flowers in the boxes flanking the front steps.

Ten years ago

The highways on the Gulf Islands did not need the 66-foot width required by the department of highways, said Hugh Curtis, MLA for Saanich and the Islands. He defended the narrow roads of the islands as woodland charm which delights visitors and residents alike.

The Pender Island Red Cross drive gathered \$657.25. The nine women were successful in collecting the money during the campaign on the island.

The problems caused by exuberant visitors in parks on Salt Spring would not be repeated, said an RCMP officer. There would be 10 policemen on the island to keep a lid on activities during the Dominion Day holiday weekend. If more were needed, the RCMP had a pool of 50 officers to draw upon in order to keep the peace.

The Sidney bus company which had run the service for six months said the service had been stopped because a rate increase and an extension of service to the north end of the island had been rejected.

Five years ago

Improvements to the ferry terminal at Otter Bay on Pender

Island were planned. The project would cost \$27,790. New floating leads to guide the boats into the dock were to be added to allow larger vessels to use the terminal. Work was expected to be finished by the end of July.

A nine-hour marathon of bingo was set to go in Mahon Hall as part of the Sea Capers fun. The games would start at 1 pm and continue until at least 10 pm or longer depending upon the stamina of the players.

(b) the proposed C-3-A Zone allows up to eleven (11) tourist accommodation units per acre with accessory uses such as restaurants and cafes, licensed liquor establishments and retail sales. The proposed C-3-B Zone permits up to eleven (11) tourist accommodation units per acre with accessory retail sales. The size of any individual tourist accommodation unit in either zone is limited to 61 square metres (657 square feet);

(c) the zoning classifications of Lot A, Section 12, Plan 13929, Mayne Island, Cowichan District (the "Springwater Lodge") and Lot 83, Section 9, Plan 14000, Mayne Island, Cowichan District (the "Mayne Inn") are changed from the C-3 Zone to the C-3-A Zone;

(d) the zoning classifications of Lot A, Section 9, Plan 6587, Mayne Island, Cowichan District ("Marisol Village"), that portion of the fractional S.W. 1/4 of Section 12, bounded on the West by Lot 19, Plan 15136, on the North by Naylor Road and the sea, on the East by Village Bay Road, and on the South by a line commencing 200 feet South of the N.E. corner of the lot and running due West to Lot 19, Plan 15136, Mayne Island, ("Bennett's") and Lots 14 and 15, Section 9, Plan 15114, Mayne Island, Cowichan District ("The Blue Vista") are changed from the C-3 Zone to the C-3-B Zone; and

(e) "Tourist Accommodation Unit" is defined.

2. Proposed By-law No. 26 for Mayne Island is a By-law to amend Mayne Island Zoning By-law No. 14 being "Mayne Island Planning Area Zoning By-law, 1980", as follows:

In general terms the intent of Proposed By-law No. 26 is:

(a) the term "Bed and Breakfast" is defined and permitted as a home occupation, subject to conditions; and

(b) the construction and use of "Guest Cottages" is restricted to lots larger than 0.6 hectare (1.5 acres).

3. Proposed By-law No. 28 for Mayne Island is a By-law to amend Mayne Island Zoning By-law No. 14 being "Mayne Island Planning Area Zoning By-law, 1980" as follows:

In general terms the intent of Proposed By-law No. 28 is:

(a) areas of water abutting the western shore of Curlew Island are included within the "Mayne Island Planning Area", zoned "W-2 (Water Moorage)", and Capital Regional District By-law No. 103, 1972 (Zoning By-law Planning Area No. 4 (Outer Gulf Islands) is repealed for these areas;

(b) the terms "Moorage" and "Wharfage" are defined; and

(c) "Wharfage" is made a permitted use in the "W-2 (Water Moorage)" Zone, subject to conditions.

4. Proposed By-law No. 29 for Mayne Island is a By-law to amend Mayne Island Zoning By-law No. 14 being "Mayne Island Planning Area Zoning By-law, 1980" as follows:

In general terms the intent of Proposed By-law No. 29 is:

(a) the terms "Boathouse", "Pumphouse" and "Structure" are defined;

(b) a section is added to the By-law as "Section 4.15" which defines how building setbacks are to be measured, states situations in which setback reductions may be made, and requires a setback between "Guest Cottage" and "Single Family Dwelling Unit"; and

(c) Section 4.14 is replaced by a new definition of how residential building density is to be determined.

McNeil explained the operation of the instruments pertaining to weather reports.

Neither well satisfactory

The water from one well at the Pender Island School tastes salty and the water from the other well is too hard to drink.

Water for the school is being supplied from two containers which are filled daily from other sources. The well water at the school is used in the washrooms.

Frank Sutherland, supervisor of facilities for the school district, told the board that the water of the new well could be treated. He had received a tentative cost estimate for treatment which would amount to \$12,000 for 400 gallons per day.

The school could also tap into another system, he said. A letter has been sent to the Pender Health Clinic, across the road, requesting such a hook-up.

The third option, which would be expensive, was to drill a new well.

The well containing salty water had recently been drilled at a cost of more than \$10,000.

When the water of the older well was checked recently, Sutherland told *Driftwood*, it was found to contain bacteria. He said the bacteria could have come from surface runoff which seeped into the well.

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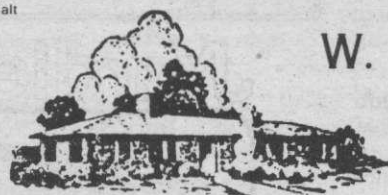


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
