# Campers can choose from five parks here

Campers have a choice of five provincial parks in the Gulf Islands.

The largest is Ruckle Park on Salt Spring Island. The park is located at the end of Beaver Point Road at the south end of the island. There are 24 campsites available plus a large area for pitching tents. Cost per night for the campsites is \$5.

In Ganges, Mouat Park offers 15 campsites and costs \$5 for each night. The park is located at the end of Seaview Avenue at the foot of Ganges Hill.

Mount Maxwell Park at the top of the mountain can be reached by travelling up Cranberry Road which leaves the main highway at the top of Ganges Hill. The park features a scenic view from the peak and visitors are reminded that no camping is allowed in the park.

On Galiano Island, Montague Marine Park offers access by land and sea. The park has 31 campsites available and cost is \$7 per campsite per night. The wharf at the marina can be used, if space is available, at a cost of \$1 per metre of vessel length. Moorage buoys and anchorages are available in the channel.

On North Pender Island, Prior Park sits off Bedwell Harbour Road. It has 17 campsites and costs visitors \$5 per night.


Beaumont Marine Park is located on South Pender Island and is only accessible from the water in Bedwell Harbour. There are 11 campsites and moorage and anchorage is available in the bay. There is no cost involved in staying in the park.

In addition to the provincial parks, there are commercial campsites available on each of the islands except Mayne and Saturna Islands.

# Fish found almost anywhere in island waters

Sport fishing in the Gulf Islands is a tradition that seems to get bigger each year. If you live on the islands, or are vacationing here this summer, you will probably find yourself out on the "chuck" or casting from a wharf. The pleasure found in spending a day on the water is as worthwhile as catching the fish. Sport fishing provides the opportunity to "taste" the great outdoors in more ways than one.

Before you head out to sea, make sure you have your salt water fishing licence and a copy of the regulations. If you have any questions, check with the local fisheries officer.

Salmon fishing is the big draw for most people and the fish can be found almost anywhere in Gulf Island waters. The most popular spots, generally speaking, are Sansum Narrows, East Point, Porlier Pass, Gossip Island, Pender Bluffs and James Island. But every locale has its own "great spots".

Bluebacks, or immature coho, are plentiful during the spring and early summer. Spring, or chinook, are the most dependable catch in the islands. The pink salmon run in two-year cycles and this is an off-year, but there are still a few around for the taking. The average salmon caught in the Gulf Islands weighs about 7 lbs. Some of the luckier sportsmen have brought

The Salt Spring club is also a member of the B.C. Council of Yacht Clubs, which is a lobbying group designed to protect the interests of boaters. This group is mainly concerned with water safety and the condition of waters in their district.

The council works in coordination with the ministry of forests to keep district waters free of debris. Council members are active participants in the Flag-a-Snag program which uses flags made by the Handicapped Association, to mark snags and deadheads.

The Salt Spring Sailing Club supports government agencies such as the Power Squadron and the Coast Guard through educational programs in navigation and water safety.

In addition to these programs the club operates a moorage exchange with other yacht clubs. They are presently involved with the Royal Victoria, Deep Cove, Sidney-North Saanich, and Maple Bay Yacht Clubs and the Vancouver Rowing Club. In the future, the program is expected to extend into the United States.

The Salt Spring Island Sailing Club welcomes new memberships. Membership allows one to take part in any function or races presented by the club For more

in catches as large as 56 lbs.

According to local experts, the chinook salmon tend to feed at around 80 feet and then descend to 120 feet. Coho can usually be found at the 80-foot

Every fisherman seems to have his own method for hooking the big ones. You can try mooching for the salmon with live or frozen bait, or jiggling with a lure. Trolling with a downrigger is considered to be the most sporting method for catching salmon. The weight is released when the fish is on the line and the fish tends to play longer and harder.

Whichever method you choose, the experts suggest that you use bait fish common to the area. In the Gulf Islands they recommend using herring. Some experts suggest that locally created lures bring the best

In the islands, they recommend the Riptide from Cowichan and the Buzz Bomb from Courtenay. These are available, along with the many other favourites, at most local tackle shops.

Cod fishing is also popular throughout the Gulf Islands. They can be found in most rocky areas. Rock cod are plentiful all year round and the average catch weighs about 11/2 lbs., but some weigh as much as 6 lbs.

Ling is a favorite catch among cod fishermen. The average male ling weighs around 6 lbs. but the females can weigh as much as 50 lbs. The females are usually found in deep water at the 200-foot mark. This year, the ling cod season is open to November

Dungeness and rock crab are readily available throughout the Gulf Islands. They can be found in almost any sandy bay. Mostpeople bait their crab traps with fish heads and such. Always Cont'd. next page

# RHODONITE:

A Semi-Precious Gem Stone Mined on Salt Spring Island

Rhodonite derives its name from the Greek word rhodon, meaning rose, and varies in colour from deep rose to soft pink. Exceptionally hard, Rhodonite's chief importance is in the making of jewellery and ornamental objects.

This semi-precious gem stone was discovered on Salt Spring Island approximately 30 years ago, and over the years Salt Spring Island Rhodonite has gained an international reputation for its brilliance, colour and unusually high quality.


Rhodonite is relatively scarce, but deposits have been found in Australia and the Russian Urals. During the 19th century, Rhodonite became a fashionable gem stone in Russia, and the Imperial Jeweller, Carl Faberge, was particularly famous for his work in this stone.

check with the local fisheries office for closures or regulations in your area. Fulford Harbour on Salt Spring Island has a ban on the use of crab traps, but wading and catching the crab with dip nets is allowed.

Oysters and clams are found along most shores in the Gulf Islands. Once again, it is best to check with local authorities for closures

If you are purchasing gear for salt water fishing this summer, make sure the reel you buy is made from non-corrosive material. The reel should also have a minimum line capacity of 100 yards. Tackle used in salt water should be rinsed periodically with fresh water to prevent corrosion.

Fishing line should be stored away from sunlight. Line should be checked regularly to make sure it is free of tangles. Eyelets on the rod should be checked for nicks. These can be repaired with nail polish or varethane or the eyelets can be replaced. The reel should be kept well oiled and cleaned. It pays to keep your gear in good order. You will cut your replacement costs and keep more fish.

When fishing in the Gulf Islands, always take care to conform to safety regulations. The Coast Guard reports that most accidents on the water are the result of inexperience. Learn to read the charts. They tell you where you are and what is underneath your boat.

See that you have enough fuel for your trip. When fishing in congested areas, make sure that you understand the rules and regulations that apply to traffic flow.

Sport fishing is certainly one of the favourite recreational activities in the Gulf Islands. Those who participate in this sport will readily attest to its numerous rewards.



# Light plants were common

Electricity was not always readily available to the islands even though the traveller who visits an island resort today

### Chimney fire on ferry

Hazard facing islanders has no threat for those who live away from the sea.

During the summer of 1946 the valiant old Cy Peck was sailing the islands when there was a chimney fire aboard.

The vessel was carrying 135 passengers on a summer cruise off the northern tip of Salt Spring Island. There was a heavy flame from the smoke stack and a spark burned a passenger's coat.

A bucket brigade put out the fire with no other damage to passengers. The funnel lost some of its paint, the ship lost a short time spent in firefighting and Capt. George Maude lost an opportunity to beach the vessel. He admitted later that the thought of beaching had occurred to him.

takes power for granted.

After the second war there were various plants providing power for individuals. Galiano was no exception and Galiano Lodge was one of the resorts in need of electricity. Islanders operating lighting plants were suffering regular breakdowns and sharing their sorrows.

Operators of six such plants got together and formed a power company to serve the community. Volunteer labour planted the poles and a large diesel-driven generator was acquired to pump out the power.

Within four years the small, community power corporation was operating three diesel generators and serving 75 customers.

In 1956 the British Columbia Power Corporation undertood to serve the islands and the diesel units were retired.

Ten years or so later the island people once again got together to undertake a do-it-yourself project of carrying power to North Galiano.



#### They are unique

The Canadian Gulf Islands are unique. They enjoy a climate unlike any in Canada and the environment is peculiar to the islands But not even the environment is the same throughout the islands and the vegetation and wildlife will be found to vary even between adjacent islands.

# Museums at Mayne and Salt Spring

Visitors to the Gulf Islands can view the past at two museums: the Bittancourt House on Salt Spring Island and the Plumper Pass lockup on Mayne Island.

The Bittancourt House sits on the Farmers' Institute grounds on Rainbow Road in Ganges. It was moved to the site from its original location at Vesuvius.

Built 100 years ago by Estalon Bittancourt, the house served for many years as the annex to the Vesuvius Inn and store.

The facility will be open each Saturday and Sunday from June 30 to Labour Day. Times are

from 11 am until 4 pm.
On display inside are items which show the life of early pioneers on Salt Spring Island. A series of photographs, reproduced for the museum by the Salt Spring Camera Club, depict early houses. A map of the island shows the location of the houses.

In addition, the B.C. Museum has loaned the local museum a display of early locking devices.

Admittance is free but a box

for donations is near the door. The Plumper Pass lockup was once the Gulf Islands police station. Built in 1896, it housed the office and two cells for a single constable who had responsibility for the Gulf Islands from Porlier Pass to the U.S. border. The early constable patrolled the islands in a 16-foot rowboat equipped with a sail.

The last time the cells were used to house a prisoner was in 1912. The building was restored to its original condition by the Mayne Island Agricultural society for the centenmal of the

# Potter transforms three tons of clay annually

Salt Spring potter Bas Cobanli considers himself to be a craftsman rather than an artist but the people of Camosun College may have a different opinion.

The Victoria community college is creating a permanent display of arts and crafts and one of the people they asked to submit work is Cobanli.

He became interested in pottery when his wife Gillian enrolled in a pottery course

while they lived in Vancouver.
"She came home," he recalls, "and started talking about it." So he checked the course and spent the next three months in classes learning how to make sure a lump of clay resembled something when he was finished with it.

But that's the extent of his formal training. "I was sort of a self-apprentice," he says. Cobanli learned the craft from reading books and magazines as well as working the clay.

When he and his family moved to Salt Spring and built their house on Scott Point, Cobanli began to look for something to do. He made some pots and eventually a couple of young ladies showed up at the door wanting to buy. That started his new career.

Cobanli was born in Istanbul, Turkey, and went to England in 1950 to study at Loughborough College. While there he met his wife who hails from Cheshire.

Following Cobanli's graduation with a degree in engineering, they moved to Vancouver to begin a new life and a family. Eldest son Richard is 23 and is a second mate on the search and rescue vessel Provost

Wallace out of Halifax, Nova

Bruce is 22 and enrolled in the fine arts department at UVic while daughter Jane, 16, attends Gulf Islands Secondary School

The move to Salt Spring came in 1973. The family came to farm but that project never got off the ground because, Cobanli claims, he's "never grown anything successfully in (his) life."

Cobanli sells his work through selected retail craft outlets and from his workshop. Many of the pieces he produces these days are commissions. For those jobs he deals with the public through his agent/alter ego, Fred Blogs.

He produces items which are functional. "My pieces are meant to be used rather than be put on a shelf."

But being a potter isn't a free and easy life. There is a discipline required to being a good potter.

"You have to be a selfstarter," he explained, "and go out there and make the stuff.

"Clay is not forgiving," he added, "if it's time to finish. Then you have to damn well better be there."

Cobanli transforms about three tons of clay to "functional items" each year. The clay comes from Alberta and as far away as Georgia. He explained that the clay on Salt Spring was not suitable for fire-clay but he does use local clay for glazes.

The production of a pot requires about six weeks. Cobanli throws the pot on a wheel and sets it aside to dry. When sufficient pieces have accumulated, he glazes them and puts them in the kiln.

The pots are stacked in the kiln and it is bricked up. The propane fire is started and heat is allowed to build up overnight. The temperature inside the kiln reaches 1,280 degrees C. The pots are fired for 12 hours and it takes the kiln two days to cool off to allow the contents to be

Cobanli has his glaze mixtures programmed in a computer.

The glaze, he explained, is basically glass over the form.

The glaze is powdered rock such as felspars, limestones and others. The pot is dipped into it and when the item is fired, the glaze fuses to the form. The colour of the finished product comes from the glaze. Each of the different metallic elements produces a different colour.

Cobanli's hobbies, in addition to his pottery, involve computers and sailing vessels.



vessels. His latest vessel, Haereticus, is moored in Long Harbour just below the house.

So far, Cobanli has built two Cobanli can look from his living room window and see his boat.




The Community Church of Mayne Island holds regular service at 10 am in St. Mary Magdalene with Sunday school slated for 9:30 am.



Although Saturna Island is larger than Mayne and nearly the size of Pender, it boasts the smallest population and most untouched landscape. Saturna Island is hard to reach without taking ferry transfers and island hopping. This difficulty in accessibility allows Saturna Island a peace and quiet no longer found on the other four Gulf Islands.

Almost everyone goes to the famous Saturna Lamb Barbecue on July 1 every year. This barbecue put Saturna Island on the map in 1949 when a group of islanders gathered to cook up a few lambs. Today, as many as 30 lambs are roasted over spits and up to 1,500 people travel to Saturna Beach to line up for the succulent lamb dinner.

Other than the Saturna Lamb Barbecue, very little else happens on Saturna Island.

But there are scenic spots on Saturna and the Boot Cove Lodge provides accommodation. Lyall Harbour Beach is one of the few accessible beaches on the island.

A non-denominational church, St. Andrew's, is located on East

A lookout point can be found atop Mount Warburton Pike which stands at 490 metres.

### Public wharves at each island

Each of the Gulf Islands has public wharves compliments of the small craft harbours branch of the federal department of fisheries.

Berthing priorities at such wharves filters through Canadian fishing vessels, commercial vessels to recreational vessels. Recreational vessels are encouraged to make use of the various marinas but the public harbours can be used if the visitors are passing through.

Each vessel seeking a berth at a public wharf should contact the local harbour manager on arrival to arrange for space or other amenities offered. Fees are payable at some of the wharves. Rafting during busy periods is a necessity and boaters are asked not to place obstructions which would hinder other vessels from coming alongside.

Visitors are also asked to observe posted signs, segregate vessels according to type and follow instructions of the harbour manager.

The public harbour on Saturna Island is at Lyall Harbour with berth space of 124

On Pender, Bedwell Harbour has 50 m of berth space and the wharf is protected by a breakwater. Lights and telephone are available. Canadian Customs have an office at Bedwell and visitors from below the line should check

Through the canal on the Penders, Browning Harbour has 50 m of berth space on the wharf protected by a breakwater. Up the coast of North Pender, Hope Bay contains 141 m of berth space with lights and telephone on the wharf. Port Washington on the other side of the island has 112 m of wharf with berth space available.

Mayne Island has Horton Bay with 124 m of berth space. Garbage facilities and lights are available. Miners Bay on the Active Pass side of Mayne has 47 m of berth space with lights.

On Galiano Island, Sturdies Bay has 48 m of wharf and a derrick is handy. Whaler Bay,



During the goldrush, Mayne Island's Miners Bay was a favourite stop-over for thirsty, gold-seeking miners. Favourite traveller's rests were the Mayne Island Inn at Bennett Bay and the Springwater Lodge in Miners Bay, both built in the 19th century.

It is believed that Mayne Island was the first area in British Columbia where King apples were grown. Today, Mayne Island remains the cleared, rolling farmland it was before this century. Orchards and sheep farming continue to provide Mayne Island with an industry of its own.

Art galleries on Mayne Island are numerous. The Rootseller in Miners Bay continues to hold occasional shows of islanders' work, in addition to galleries located at Bennett Bay and off Waugh Road

Mayne's comparatively small population and hilly landscape give it an old-farm flavour and peace.

nearby, has 185 m of space with lights and another derrick. Montague Harbour contains 103 m of wharf. Further up the island, Retreat Cove has a 49 m wharf and at Porlier Pass, the wharf is only 15 m but a derrick is available.

Salt Spring Island contains four small harbours and two major facilities.

At Fernwood, on the Trincomali Channel side of the island, there is 24 m of wharf space. Moving to the other side of the island, Vesuvius Bay has 29 m of space while Burgoyne Bay has a 21 m wharf. Musgrave Landing has a 24 m wharf.

Fulford Harbour has 73 m of

berth space. Facilities available include garbage disposal, parking, fresh water, lights and power.

Ganges Harbour contains 653 m of berth space with part protected by a breakwater. Other facilities include a boat launching ramp, garbage disposal, parking, lights, power and telephones.

More information can be obtained from the various harbour managers or from Fisheries and Oceans, Small Craft Harbours Branch, in Vancouver, phone 666-1250.

Had HMS Raccoon foundered on her voyage from London to the Columbia River in 1812, the state of Oregon would have remained the province of Oregon, a very part of the future British North America.

If Capt. W. Black had engaged the hostility of Macbeth's witches they might well have sent him a storm and brought to nought the burgeoning plans to make British North America

Capt. Black, with his dreams of avarice and his taste for Madeira wine sailed across the world to a new fortune in a new world. Alas for him. He found no fortune. In his frustrated pomposity, however, he dissipated one.

It was all this way.
The North West Company was trading in British Columbia territory purchasing furs from the Indian hunters for a song and selling them profitably. Starting from the Fraser the North West Company worked south to the Columbia. At that time the Columbia was considered the international

When John Jacob Astor cast covetous eyes on the Pacific fur trade it was a young business. The North West Company was no great distance ahead. In Canada as in the United States fur trading had come west overland and only now was the maritime area considered as a possibly lucrative business.

This new trade was fraught with new dangers. Hostile Indian warriors were to be found everywhere. On the coast there were hostile waters and winds to contend with.

Astor established Astoria and operated out of that tiny fort. It was his arrival on the coast that sparked the Nor'westers into action. Competition meant they had to start active trading in the Columbia River. They were a trading company with close political ties back home in London, but they could interest nobody in the establishment of a base on the Pacific. Harrassed by Napoleon and closely watchful of Washington, London had its hands full already. The traders were left to meet the situation as they might.

In 1812 the United States declared war against Britain and the picture changed. The War of 1812 was to win Oregon to the Stars and Stripes forever.

The Nor'Westers gained government support in equipping a supply ship and convoy to sail across the world. The company also arranged that the new United States company would be warned off by an overland expedition. The overland party was travelling south from the Okanagan and the sea route was around the Cape.

There was some monkey business going on, however. In base on the Pacific and it was this base that was to be freed from the American yoke and restored to the Union Jack.

To the naval party this meant prize money and great rewards. To the overland party of company officials it was routine, travelling through strange land peopled by a hostile native populace. While British ships sailed

through wind and sunshine, the British civilian party pressed into the Columbia basin.

The Americans had started a vigorous trading and had been inspired with the first fruits. By 1813 the supply ship had failed to arrive and the company's men were getting restive. They were low on supplies and the trade was proving less lucrative than earlier forays had suggested.

In the spring of 1813 John McTavish arrived on the coast to find no supply ship or navy force. He withdrew from Fort Astoria to return in October of the same year with a force of 75

It was the last straw for the American traders. Low on funds, food and hope, they sold out to the North West Company. They sold everything: posts, property and stock of

The Stars and Stripes came down the pole and up went the Union Jack. It was British territory again. There were no soldiers involved in this action. The British company had negotiated the war with the American company.

But when HMS Raccoon arrived on the scene a month or so later, the good captain was outraged. The vigorous opposition he had expected from a fortified port proved to be negotiated away and the fortifications were almost non-

He could have overpowered the settlement with one fourpounder, said Capt. Black in

But the gallant sea dog was not prepared to see a territory ceded by mere civilians. Before he sailed away on December 12, 1813, Capt. Black organized a proper military ceremony. Accompanied by a marine officer and four sailors, he raised the Union Jack and in a loud voice announced that he was taking possession of the country in the name of His Britannic Majesty. He renamed the fort, Fort George.

The war ended and the Treaty of Ghent established clear boundaries between Canada and the United States. Part of the negotiations made it clear that all property won from the Americans had to be relin-

territory from the United States. His proclamation said so. There was no British government spokesman to challenge the United States during the negotiations and Oregon was formally named a state of the

Had the naval officer kept to his cabin and permitted the two companies to negotiate their agreement, Oregon would have remained Canadian, because until the ceremony under Capt. Black it had not been identified as territory won during the War

Another British government might well have held out, but the British ministers had no slightest comprehension of the Pacific coast and were not eager to press for a territory they little valued.



Pender Island is unique among the Gulf Islands for the canal that separates North Pender from South Pender, with a bridge joining the two islands.

The bridge crossing from North to South Pender is a scenic one, and allows the traveller a view of both Browning and Bedwell Harbours on either side.

Nearby Medicine Beach in Bedwell Harbour and Hamilton Beach in Browning Harbour are inviting picnic spots.

Pender's population is concentrated on North Pender Island and a large portion of the population lives at the Magic Lake Estates subdivision.

The Pender Island Golf and Country Club, with its newly finished clubhouse, offers an exciting nine-hole course. The Penders are home to artists and potters and local crafts can be found at Port Washington and the Driftwood Centre, as well as at roadside stands.

Scenic views are found at the 120-metre lookout point of Bald Cone and at Mount Norman on South Pender which stands at 260 metres. Bald Cone can be reached on foot up a logging road.

South Pender's Beaumont Marine Park is accessible by foot or by sea and Mount Norman can be reached through the marine park. Both boast spectacular views.

#### Oldest on Salt Spring

# Prepare your boat for enjoyable trip

If a boat undergoes proper preparations, a trip will be enjoyable and fuel consumption will be kept low.

With the boat out of the water, several checks should be

Look at the hull and if it isn't clean, get busy. A clean hull reduces underwater drag. Tune the engine. Set the ignition timing and clean or replace spark plugs. The carburetor should have proper float level, correct jetting and smooth choke operation.

When the hull is checked, make sure the propellor is part of the clean-up. Keep the blades clean and in good condition because a damaged propeller contributes to fuel waste.

For the trip to the boat launching ramp, make sure the trailer is in good shape. Keep the tires properly inflated and grease the wheel bearings. Get in and out of the launching ramp area with a minimum of fuss and

Another means of saving fuel is to plan trips. The shortest course between here and there should be taken to ensure the

least amount of running time.

And don't overload the boat. Keep it light and you won't need extra horsepower. A balanced load, passengers and equipment, helps the boat to plane quickly when getting under way.

Watch the weather. If prevailing winds and sea conditions are questionable, delay departure. Choppy seas and brisk winds translate to high fuel consumption. As well, check the tides. Moving against the tide requires more effort from the engine. Use the tides to your advantage.

High speed runs can be thrilling and also can be costly in terms of fuel. A wide open throttle drinks fuel up to 50% faster than mid-range speeds. When you have to stop, don't idle the engine but turn it off. A warm engine will start easily without having to choke it.

To enjoy water-related activities such as fishing, exploring or just sunning, take shorter trips. Aim for those areas close to home where boating can be enjoyed without having to fill the gas tank all that




