Scholarship acceptance dates are being posted.



Don't let a good haul be your last reward

Natural elements greatest challenge to monkey research work in Borneo

A Fulford Harbour woman's recent four-month stay in Borneo meant coping with a daily diet of stifling heat, poisonous snakes and hordes of mosquitoes and

Anne Zeller, an associate professor at the University of Waterloo, was studying macaque monkeys at an orangutan rehabilitation centre in Borneo. While there, she also spent a good deal of time with the orangutans.

The Borneo centre was established to help introduce the orangutans to the wild. Most of them were originally illegally - taken as pets.

"It was very interesting work even though living there was quite a challenge," Zeller said. "The bugs were terrible. The mosquitoes were really bad at night; we didn't go outside at night unless we had to. The flies were a constant bother as well. But we made sure we had a lot of bug repellent on hand.'

Snakes were another visitor to the camp. "There were a lot of snakes around, both poisonous and otherwise," she said. "I was never bitten although I did step over a Banded Crate one time. We also had to contend with fire ants that would eat everything in their path."

At the centre, Zeller studied adult-infant interaction and socialization of the macaque monkeys. "These monkeys are a very popular lab animal, but not much is known about them in the wild," she said. "There are 12 species and they range from Gibraltar to Japan, but aren't found in Africa.

The monkeys are natural inhabitants of the region around the centre, which made the locale convenient for Zeller.

After her lengthy stay in Borneo, Zeller said she had trouble readjusting to the Canadian climate upon her return.

"It got so that if the temperature went below 35° Celsius, it began to feel cold," she said.

Zeller added: "I don't think I

will be going back to Borneo to do any more studying. I will be continuing my studies, but it will be at the Monkey Jungle in Florida."



country gourmet

It's not necessary to be John Wayne or Miss Kitty to eat sirloin, rare, with a chilled Coors to wash it down . . . but it helps. The baked potato, the horse and the Winstons are optional.

Etymology supports this image. A good rugby player is beefy. The yeomen who guard the Tower of London are Beefeaters and people as different, otherwise, as little old ladies and predatory businessmen use that hideous expression, Where's the beef?

"The Englishmen understand almost better than any other people the art of properly roasting a joint, which also is not to be wondered at; because the art of cooking as practised by most Englishmen does not extend much beyond roast beef and plum pudding."

This faint praise of Anglo-Saxon cuisine was given not in the Michelin guide but by an aghast Swedish diplomat at the end of the 17th Century.

My experience of dining in hall for two years at an Oxford College agreed with his assessment. Our chef was a closet Communist who considered students, in particular those taking ancient languages, to be effete and decadent parasites who drained the life blood of society, etc., etc. He rejoiced in a cuisine that reduced everything to the consistency of charred cement and, consequently, often forced us to eat in the White Horse pub across the road.

This was not a sacrifice. For one thing the fare was of the steakand-kidney pie variety and savoury if monotonous, and for another such literary eminences as J.R.R. Tolkien stood next to you at the bar, as he escaped from HIS chef.

Beef is definite, dense and requires good dentition, but it is rarely distinguished, except by price in the kind of pretentious steak-house that features a glass-enclosed cook with walrus moustaches who prances around your immolated filet mignon amid gusts of flame and the flashing of razor sharp knives like a member of Ghengis Khan's general staff.

Beef brings out the worst in people in other ways. A well-known chain of restaurants with a Scottish name boasts about how many million identical hamburgers it has sold. But shouldn't this be a slogan of abuse, not praise?

The unmistakable aftertaste echoes just as long in the memory (and other places) but now you can digest it amid an abundance of glass, brass, varnished woodwork and walls painted in soothing tertiary colours. The architecture of their buildings now bears a strange and unsettling resemblance to the two other cultural shrines of the west, our banks and churches.

On the other hand, I do love beef, provided it is afforded the attention most would lavish upon more demanding foods. I am profoundly grateful that I grew up in a house where an excellent.

roast of beef and Yorkshire pudding dinner was served every Sunday evening at quarter to six precisely.

The secret of this most English of dishes is to imitate the traditional farm kitchen in which the roast was cooked beside the high heat of a coal fire and the drippings were collected in a pan below and used with milk, eggs, flour and salt to make the Yorkshire

Beef-tea, stews, steaks, tournedos, curries, sweetbreads, tongue, and then, the terror of children, liver. Try my recipe for calves' liver for a light lunch, or a country supper after a hike or a climb.

Calves' Liver

1 lb. calves' liver flour 2 T olive oil

1 t oregano 1/2 t parsley seed

Roll the pieces of liver in flour then season with basil, oregano and ground parsley seed. Saute 2-3 minutes on each side. Best served with green beans and small new buttered potatoes.

If you're a Sunday Beefeater but can forsake, for one week only, the Yorkshire pudding, this recipe for Roast Sirloin With Juniper Sauce is a marvellous ending to an afternoon spent reading by the fire while winter rains lash the windows in futile rage at your indifference to the weather.

Roast Sirloin With Juniper Sauce

3 lb. sirloin, roast of beef 2 t thyme

basil, a pinch

SHOOL Chalcon, \$7.55 Atlantic Prov.

1 t lovage 2 t rosemary

I t celery seed sauce: 4-5 juniper berries, crushed 1/4 t cumin

1 t coriander

2 t honey

1/4 t pepper 1 C beef stock 1/4 C raisins. pan drippings 2 t cider vinegar 2 t olive oil

Wash and dry the sirloin roast and remove any excess fat. In a mortar grind thyme, celery seed, lovage and rosemary. Rub these herbs onto the roast and then cover with foil. Roast in a 325 oven for two hours. For the sauce first crush juniper berries. Mix these with

cumin and coriander (the culinary twins) and basil. Sweeten with honey and add raisins. Pour beef stock, pan drippings, cider vinegar and olive oil over these ingredients. Bring to the boil then reduce for half an hour over a low heat. Serve the slices of beef in the juniper

Accompany with roast potatoes, green beans and a glass of Medoc or Beaujolais.



The Sheep Protection Act requires that all dogs be licenced and that any farmer may shoot a dog if it is caught molesting sheep

A \$10 reward is offered to anyone who destroys an offending dog. Farmers' Institute president George Heinekey said some rewards have been paid out recent-

Twenty years ago

Little ships are back in ship-

The Salt Spring Queen is back on the Fulford-Swartz Bay run after her annual refit. The Pender Queen has been on the Fulford run for several weeks, filling in for both the Salt Spring Queen and the Vesuvius Queen.

Passengers have enjoyed the greater speed of the Pender Queen, although the heating plant appears to be inadequate for the season.

One of the oldest buildings on

Salt Spring Island went up in flames on Saturday. The home of Col. and Mrs. C.E. Bailey, which had stood overlooking Trincomali Channel since 1856, was almost completely destroyed by the fire.

The Baileys were not home at the time of the fire, which was attributed to a malfunctioning furnace. In addition to the loss of their home, the Baileys lost many family heirlooms and antiques.

Fifteen years ago

Malcolm Muggeridge, noted writer and British radio and television personality, took part in the service at Ganges United Church this week. The sermon took the form of a dialogue, with Muggeridge speaking on the subject of God and Caesar.

The author of many books, including Jesus Rediscovered, Muggeridge has been living this past winter at Vesuvius Bay.

Police are looking for two young men who beat a Salt Spring Island resident with a hammer and took his wallet after he gave them a ride.

Harry Williamson picked up the two youths while driving from Ganges to his home at Central. After driving them out of his way, they insisted he take them all the way to the ferry terminal.

When Williamson refused, one of the assailants grabbed a hammer from behind the seat and struck him, rendering the man unconscious; when he came to, he discovered the pair had removed \$35 from his wallet.

Local waters were dotted with herring fishermen over the past weekend. The fishermen were all independents, as union fishermen were on strike for better prices for herring.

Ten years ago

A progress report on sewers was to be presented to the public by regional district personnel. Results of two studies of Ganges Harbour were to be revealed.

Meanwhile, Municipal Affairs Minister Bill Vander Zalm was visited by a delegation of seven people opposed to the sewer project.

Salt Spring Island had more than its share of small, malcontent groups, according to Outer Islands regional director Jim Campbell. He made the statement in an attack on islanders who were opposed to the threecent-a-gallon gas tax for Victoria transit.

Twice-daily seaplane runs were being considered between the Gulf Islands and Vancouver and Victoria. West Coast Air Services Ltd. believed the service had a good future. The airline carried 3,188 passengers between the islands and Vancouver last year.

Plans to raise \$75,000 for expanding the library facilities at Ganges were revealed at the library association's annual meeting. The purchase of the lot adjacent to the library had already been arranged.

The B.C. Winter Games, set for March in Fort St. John, will have a Salt Spring Island representitive. Brian Rowley of Fulford will be competeing in the speed-

skating competition.
The B.C. Winter and Summer Games are geared for provincial athletes who have not competed at the national or international level. While the games are primarily aimed at the youth of the province, they also include older folk such as Rowley, 53.

Rowley, who skates with the Esquimalt Speed-Skating Club, will have the opportunity to skate with entrants in his age bracket.

Island MP Jim Manly was the guest speaker at the Salt Spring Island NDP Club's annual meeting and potluck supper this week. He spoke on the upcoming federal election and last week's federal budget, which he compared to a large water barrel full of holes, with the trickle effect providing little help for the average person.

pump, tore it off its mountings and broke the delivery pipe.





book review

Frozen in Time, by Owen Beattie/John Geiger. Western Producer Prairie Books, Saskatoon, Saskatchewan.

Put down your well-thumbed Agatha Christie. Tuck away Sherlock for a rainy day. Now sit tight and prepare to be enthralled by a true-life thriller that provides the whodunnit to a mystery that had remained unanswered for nearly 140 years.

The puzzle: What caused the disappearance of Sir John Franklin's 1845 Arctic expedition, consisting of two lavishly-

equipped ships and 129 of the navy's finest?

The detectives: anthropologist Dr. Owen Beattie, and a dedicated team who revisited camps and gravesites of the Franklin expedition and applied 20th century forensic and anthropological science to the mystery that had haunted England for years after the ships' failure to

The unrelenting cold that must have been the torment of the seamen in their final days is what enabled Beattie to pinpoint the factors leading to their death.

Not only were artifacts from the expedition's campsites still retrievable, but three of the ships' most precious legacies lay preserved in the permafrost underneath the hard ground's surface. Their names: John Torrington, John Hartnell and William Braine.

Unknown factor in failure

The exhumation of these three frozen graves from the Franklin expedition is the climax of this book that sweeps us from the triumphant departure of the expedition from England, to Lady Franklin's despair upon their disappearance, Charles Dickens' angry refutal of Inuit claims that starving Franklin men had been witnessed engaging in cannibalism, the attempts of 19th Century searchers to trace the expedition's footsteps, and, finally, to Beattie's uncovering of the truth many years later.

While evidence found at one of the campsites indicates that cannibalism was resorted to by the desperate seamen as they trekked from their ice-bound ship in search of an inhabited trading post, the most startling discovery by far was a previously unknown factor in the failure of the expedition: lead poisoning.

One five-inch strand of John Torrington's hair indicated that the deceased had ingested lead during his eight months on the expedition, leading to acute lead poisoning. The level of lead in Torrington's body fell only slightly prior to his death, indicating his inability to take food as the condition worsened.

In 1845, tinned preserved food was still relatively new. The tin cylinders were sealed at the seams by solder containing more than 90 per cent lead. With an estimated allotment of half a pound of tinned food every second day, the sailors would have ingested a considerable amount of lead as the voyage progressed.

Told with sensitivity

Nine out of 21 of the ship's officers died early in the expedition: Beattie postulates that this high ratio is a result of a greater rate of lead ingestion due to the larger portions of the tinned food that would have been allotted them in respect of their rank.

The story is told with a sensitivity that allows us to marvel at the scientific magnitude of Beattie's findings, while always remaining touched by the poignancy of the sailors' last journey.

It is especially thought-provoking, if not outright unsettling, to

view the faces of the almost perfectly preserved seamen who last looked out at the world over 140 years ago, when Queen Victoria sat on the throne and Dickens would have been the new novelist under scrutiny in a book review column such as this one

We are used to seeing representations of that historical period in the form of faded daguerreotypes and delicate line etchings. This black and white perspective, however, is belied by the robust blue of the grave clothes, the polka dots of their kerchiefs and stripes on their shirts, a shock of brown hair, the copper plaques carefully engraved by shipmates and affixed to the coffin lids.

To see such faces, and to be privy to their story, makes for some

heavy-duty thinking.

This is one of the all-round best books I've read in a long time. Team up with some friends if you don't want to foot the p price on your own — it promises fascination for all.

Show to highlight Canadian history

Salt Spring Island is due to host three performances of a live, multi-media show outlining highlights of Canadian history.

A Canadian Story, presented by writer and entertainer Geoff Noble, is to be held at 7 pm on March 9 at Fulford Elementary School, at 7:30 pm on March 10 at Fernwood Elementary School, and at 7:30 pm on March 11 at Salt Spring Elementary School.

Tickets are available at schools, et cetera and at Patterson's Store.

A Canadian Story is a oneperson performance that offers a chronological review of Canadian history. Written, produced and performed by Noble, it lasts about 80 minutes and covers 15 topics. Included are 13 songs and a display of over 400 archival and original slides.

Noble was born in 1950 in Leeds, England. After graduating from Leeds University, he taught theatre in high schools for five years, then left teaching in 1976 to turn his attention full-time towards acting and singing.

Arriving in Canada in 1978, Noble has since worked as an entertainer and writer and performed in theatres, cabarets, folk festivals and schools. He

toured B.C. in 1980-81 with a show he wrote, Heroes and Monuments of B.C., giving over 400 performances.

Noble has since written for Parks Canada, for film and for TV, and worked as a consultant for the National Film Board. He also has supplied educational materials to B.C.'s elementary schools and produced a cassette-

National organization set to mark 75th anniversary

As it prepares to celebrate its 75th birthday in 1989, the national chapter of IODE notes that it spent over \$2.4 million on projects last year.

The bulk of the spending was made in response to the UN's International Year of Shelter for the Homeless. HMS Ganges branch of the IODE said the national chapter's contributions included more than \$300,000 spent in Canadian communities last year, in the form of assistance to crisis centres, senior citizen homes and hospitals.

In Labrador, needy children were helped through the Snack Pack program, and a science room project in Cartwright was completed.

In 1988, the national chapter of IODE also issued the Canadian Activity Book for use in schools, initiated the IODE "Hasty Note" (designed by a student in Labrador), and launched its new corporate logo.

The provincial chapter of B.C., meanwhile, donated \$150,000 to Vancouver General Hospital to build the IODE glaucoma centre. Each year, \$17,000 is also given to the eye care centre for research and study.

As well, the provincial chapter

provided funds to improve physical and other amenities in senior residences, and purchased a minibus for a neighbourhood house. Funds are also provided for diabetes research and for music scholarships.

The bulk of IODE activities operate at the local level. There, chapters of the order support needs vital to communities, by way of bursaries and scholarships to educational and art institutions, gifts to libraries and, in the form of services, through timely and needed gifts and donations to various institutions.

The national organization of the order is composed of three interdependent chapters. The national chapter is responsible for projects of concern to Canadians nationwide; the provincial chapters create special projects needed by the provinces and act as a liaison with the primary, or local, chap-

Ukraine visit prompts publication of stories

Some people go to great lengths to have their writing published, but Charles Crosby of Salt Spring seems to have taken the process one step further than

After a recent visit to the Soviet Union with his wife Helen, the Stewart Road man has had several articles published in the News from Ukraine, a weekly newspaper originating in Kiev in the Ukraine.

The Crosbys, who travelled to the Soviet Union to explore Helen's Ukrainian roots, said they found the visit enlightening.

"The North American media give a very slanted view of life in the Soviet Union," said Helen. "Everywhere we went we met well-dressed, well-educated and friendly people. They were very open and frank in their conversations and went out of their way to help us even though we were complete strangers to them."

Because Helen has a fairly

good command of Ukrainian, the couple was able to travel around Kiev on their own and did not have to rely on the tourist buses.

'We wanted to travel around the city and meet ordinary working people," said Charles. 'Thanks to Helen's being able to speak the language we were able

The Crosbys said they were most impressed with Kiev, which was destroyed in the Second World War. "It is so beautiful," said Helen. "There are memorials, the world famous Kiev Opera House, churches and cathedrals and much more. You just can't stop admiring the beauty of the city which was literally raised from the ashes.

While in Kiev, the Crosbys visited the office of the newpaper and were interviewed by a reporter named Mykola Chepovetsky.

"The staff at the newpaper were wonderful to us," said Charles. "They not only interviewed us but Mykola and the editor, Victor Stelmakh, took us around the city and out to dinner. It was around that time that they asked me to submit some of the stories I had written about Ukrainians living in Canada. I did and they have published two so far."

The two stories - one a fictionalized acount of a Ukrainian immigrant living in northern Manitoba and the other a story about Santa Claus sharing a Christmas Eve meal with the cat and mouse of a house - were printed in the Kiev newspaper after the couple returned to Canada.

"After that visit I feel that I have a great deal more that I can write about" said Charles.

Jail terms given to two theft participants

Two Ganges men have been sentenced to jail terms for their involvement in a break, enter and theft on Twilight Island.

The sentence, handed down February 7 in Ganges provincial court by Judge R.E. Hudson, was contrary to recommendations made by a probation officer and by the counsel for the defence.

Judge Hudson commended Steven Konig and Cory Marsden for the progress they had made over the last several months, but said only a jail term would serve as an adequate deterrent to

"I am impressed by the progress of these two," the judge said. "But they are guilty and the offence is serious.

Konig and Marsden pleaded guilty to the break, enter and theft charges last month in provincial court. Sentencing was adjourned to allow for a report on each offender.

Charges were laid after Konig and Marsden stole a boat from a Ganges marina last June. The accompanied by two young offenders - travelled to Twilight Island, where they broke into a cabin and stole a quantity of miscellaneous items and liquor.

The boat was later found at Pender Island and the four males ere arrested at Swartz Bay.

re-sentence reports on Marson and Konig were prepared by probation officer Neil Pierce. Crown counsel Derek Lister told the court he agreed with Pierce's recommendations for a sentence including probation and counselling, but said he was also seeking jail terms.

Addressing the court, Pierce noted that both men had voluntarily made \$100 restitution to the owner of the Twilight Island home. He added that Konig, who spent close to two months in jail last fall, has since undergone a "remarkable turnaround.

Marsden, he noted, is presently undergoing drug and alcohol counselling, which is proving ffective.

Judge Hudson told the court the addresses given by the accuseds caused him to lessen their






