Lee cuts vineyard's 1st grapes

Long-time Salt Spring resident Evelyn Lee snipped the first cluster of grapes off the property she called home for 40 years.

By cutting the grapes last Tuesday morning, she helped launch Garry Oak Vineyard's inaugural vin-

"It's our way of honouring Evelyn and thanking her for the help she's given us in getting to know the land since we bought the farm from her in 1999," noted vineyard owner Marcel Mercier.

"Evelyn also connects us to the agricultural tradition started by the original Lees who first farmed on this hill over a century ago."

Garry Oaks Vineyard is located on the Fulford-Ganges portion of road commonly known as Lee's

The vineyard hopes to harvest four tons of grapes from the 10-acre farm this

wreath sales or the poppy

fall, including Pinot Gris, Pinot Noir, Gewurztraminer and Leon Millot.

"The grapes have done really well and the fruit we are getting this year is excellent," noted co-owner and wine-maker Elaine Kozak. "I am looking forward to vinifying it."

By 2006 when the vineyard is "fully mature," Mercier and Kozak hope to be producing 18-20 tons of grapes annually.

"Grape-growing is a longterm proposition," noted Mercier. "It is three years before you get commercial quantities from the vines, and five before they are in full production.'

The grapes will be "vinified" in a winery built on the property, which overlooks Burgoyne Bay.

The first wines will be released in 2003, when the winery opens for tours, tasting and sales.

Mallett offers up weekend retreat

A yoga retreat at the Salt Spring Centre this weekend will help women "create a sacred space."

The three-day event will offer a variety of experiences all geared toward "clearing space to create sacred space; clearing space to explore sacred space; and clearing space to inhabit sacred space."

Called Creating Sacred Space, the retreat is being facilitated by well-know Salt Spring yoga instructor Celeste Mallett, with guest speaker Elly Silverman, head of women's studies at the University of Calgary.

Beginning this Friday evening with registration at 4:30 p.m. and running until mid-day Sunday, the retreat offers a wide variety of instruction and experiences.

Mallett says the weekend will include meditation and simple breathing techniques called pranayama, as well as asana yoga postures, discussions, collage, journalling and collecting, a Zen tea ceremony, and Silverman's guest appearance.

"The 'sacred 'is often understood to be located outside of who you are; and 'nature' is often defined as being the world that you can see," notes Mallett in promotional material. "This weekend is designed to help (participants) follow (their) own nature to the unique sacred place within."

Through the eight aspects of Ashtanga yoga, those at the retreat will learn practices that bring them closer to a recognition of the sacred event in their daily routines

They "will leave from this weekend with the skills needed to be in concert with the grace that always surrounds them," says Mallett, who began teaching classical Hatha yoga at the Sivananda and Sunra yoga centres in London, England in the 1980s

She has been teaching at Salt Spring Centre since 1993.

A lantern parade leaves from Barb's Buns at about 5:30 p.m., and creative face painting is offered at Barb's during the day.


Also for families is the popular Family Fun Fest, with its famous cakewalk and games, set for the Community Gospel Chapel from 5-7 p.m.

Frank Moore to lead business plan course

Frank Moore spent more than 20 years working in California's Silicon Valley in business development, marketing and sales.

He says it doesn't make any difference whether you are selling potato chips or microchips, the same formulas apply.

"Many people are overwhelmed by this daunting task and even more think it is unnecessary. Building a business without a business plan is like an archer shooting an arrow into the sky hoping he hits something, as opposed to aiming at and hitting a predetermined target," said Moore. "You need to focus and see it grow."

The Community Economic Development (CED) Project is hosting a Business Plan workshop with Salt Spring resident Moore on Thursday, November 7 from 7 to 9 p.m. at Lions Hall. The workshop is one of several the project team has organized for the coming months.

Moore said that 67 per cent of small businesses that fail never developed a business plan.

"For other small to large businesses, financial and operational results range from internal start-up groups within corporations failing to overall performance of corporations being meagre at best," said Moore.

Sleep is the most moronic People talk fraternity in the world, with the heaviest dues and the crudest rituals. - Vladimir

Methinks the author of Lolita doth protest too much. That sounds like something that might have been scribbled down in the early hours of some sleepless night by a grumpy insomniac fed up with counting sheep.

Still, he does have a point. Just imagine what a Type A personality could get done if said personality didn't have to render itself unconscious for one third of its lifetime. Assuming that you, like I, hit the sack for about eight hours a night, and assuming that we both make it to our allotted three score and 10 - that means that you and I will have spent close to a quarter of a century curled up and comatose in the Land of Nod.

So how much sleep do we need? The jury is still out. Edison growled, "People eat twice too much and sleep twice too long." But Paul Martin (not him — the one who wrote the book Counting Sheep) says, "We might live longer and happier lives if we took our beds as seriously as our running shoes.'

One thing that most experts agree on is that we are all getting less sleep than we used to. Blame television, electric lights, Internet surfing, Starbucks or just the sheer hyped-up pace of modern life - whatever the cause, there are a lot of folks walking around with unclaimed luggage under their eyeballs.

And when it comes to the phenomenon of sleep, that may be just about all we can agree on. Most of our notions about sleep are erroneous.

of "sleeping the night through." In fact, we get four or five "sleeps" of about 90

minutes each. People who claim they never dream are wrong. They just don't remember them. And we talk of "sweet dreams." In fact, about two-thirds of our dreams are

unpleasant. Scientists aren't even precisely sure why we need to do to curl up and pass out once a day. Some argue we sleep to restore the body. Others say we do it to conserve energy. Certain researchers claim the function of sleep is to allow the brain to process the day's experiences and file them away in the memory banks - to help us remember, in other words.

Other researchers say the opposite: that sleep is like your computer off-switch. It prevents the brain from becoming over-loaded.

As to how much sleep we need — that, too is an open question. The health guides recommend eight hours a night, but there's a 70-yearold woman in England who claims she's never slept more than one hour a night and no daytime naps either. Researchers hied her off to a sleep lab and monitored the woman for 72 hours straight. She stayed awake for the first 56 hours (nearly two and a half days) and then slept for only an hour and a half. The records show the woman awoke refreshed, alert and in good

Well, why not? Sleep is not an absolute biological imperative. Albatrosses can

fly for 30 to 50 days without resting. As far as we can tell, whales, antelopes, shrews and giraffes don't sleep at

On the other hand, if you are of the hairless primate persuasion, it would be best if you don't try this at home. Going without sleep doesn't work very well for most humans. In fact, sleep deprivation is Dirty Trick Number One in every interrogators' Little Black Book.

Doctor Bernard Frankel,

of the U.S. National Institute of Health says bluntly: "A human being can stay awake for no longer than 12 days without permanent damage."

Besides, it feels good. Sam Coleridge wrote, "Oh, sleep! It is a gentle thing, beloved from pole to pole.

And it's not as if it's a total waste of time. Fleming dreamed up penicillin while he was asleep. The laws of heredity came to Mendel in his sleep. Einstein discovered the germ of his Law of Relativity during one of his 10-hour timeouts. And Mozart composed The Magic Flute with his eyes wide shut.

The way I look at it, sleep is inevitable. So why not lie back and enjoy it?
